# Proposed permit conditions for a whelk permit 2024 to 2025

We want your views on the proposed whelk permit conditions for 2024 to 2025.

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#### **Overview**

Proposed whelk permit fee, conditions, annual and monthly catch limits 2024-2025. The Welsh Fishing Permit (Wales) Order 2021

The Welsh Government are seeking views on proposals for the Wales whelk fishery through a 2-week consultation from 13 November to 27 November 2023. This has been discussed with the Wales Whelk Advisory Group. This is regarding the **2024-2025** whelk permit period commencing on 1 March 2024. This includes:

- the permit fee, to increase with inflationary costs to £304
- the Annual Catch Limit (ACL) to remain the same as 2023-24 at 4,768 tonnes
- no change to the initial Monthly Catch Limit (MCL) of 50 tonnes

# Whelk permit fee

The Welsh Government set out its intention to charge a fee for whelk permits. This reflects the costs of administering and managing the fishery, including stock assessment surveys, but excluding enforcement.

Recovering costs incurred by the Welsh Government in managing the whelk fishery is in line with the principles of Managing Welsh Public Money 2016. Doing so will ensure we improve upon the data which helps the fishery.

### Methodology to determine whelk permit fee

From the 2023-2024 permit period the Welsh Government will ensure the costs are accurately calculated and proportionate. Our aim will be to work toward full cost recovery within 5 years, whilst also looking to identify efficiencies and minimise costs to fishers.

An inflationary rise would result in permit fee of £304, this would take cost recovery to 20% of survey cost and is equivalent to 24% of the average price of a tonne of whelk.

#### Fee for 2024-2025 permit period

The proposal is to have the cost of the permit fee at £304. Permit conditions will be published on Whelk Fishery guidance 2024-2025 on GOV.WALES.

# **Annual Catch Limit (ACL)**

The ACL is the combined total amount of whelk which can be taken by all permitted vessels during a permit period. The purpose of the ACL is to conserve the whelk stock and ensure the fishery is sustainable.

The Welsh Government commissioned Bangor University to develop a methodology for calculating the ACL. In 2023/2024 permit period, the baseline ACL of 5,298 tonnes was reduced by 10% to 4,768 tonnes, following a mixed set of size-based indicator results.

#### ACL for 2024-2025 permit period

To inform the ACL and MCL for 2024/2025, Bangor University completed a whelk stock assessment survey in September 2023. Based on the results of the survey, there will be no change to the ACL of 4,768 tonnes.

# Flexible Monthly Catch Limit (MCL)

The MCL is the maximum amount of whelk each permitted vessel can take with pots from the Welsh zone each month. All permitted vessels will have the same amount. Once the ACL of the permitted fleet is set, it is important this is not exceeded.

Our aim is to ensure the benefit of the fishery is spread across the permit period in line with the historical fishing patterns. At present the MCL on 1 March is an initial 50 tonnes unless there is evidence to suggest a different limit. In the following months, monthly catch returns from permit holders will be used to assess the rate of progress towards the ACL. The proposal for the MCL for 2024-2025 is to remain the same.
