Projects progressing – Trunk Road Modal Shift Programme

A487 Fishguard to Cardigan

Early-stage scheme not reviewed by Panel. To continue with WelTAG process aligned to the future road building tests

A4076 Haverfordwest

A4042 Southern Corridor Pontypool to M4

NEW NTDP PROJECT: Wrexham A483 multi-modal corridor improvements and city centre connectivity

Work with Wrexham Council to develop multi-modal improvements. These will

include feasibility/investigation of creating an exemplar multi-modal residential and employment development with lower levels of car use, aligned to the future road building tests. This project replaces A483 Wrexham Bypass J3-6.

NEW NTDP PROJECT: Revised schemes for Menai Corridor

Develop options to ensure the resilience of crossing the Menai Strait in a way that supports modal shift, aligned to the future road building tests. We have asked the North Wales Transport Commission to make recommendations on how this is best achieved. This project replaces Third Menai Crossing. A494 Lon Fawr Rhuthun/Corwen Road

Small scale changes to improve safety at the junction aligned to the future road building tests

A494 Maesgammedd Road Junction

Consideration of alternative and small-scale options to improve safety, aligned to the future road building tests

A48 Cross Hands to Pensarn

A48 Nantycaws Junction Improvement

Consideration of small-scale changes to improve safety aligned to the future

road building tests. Will exclude proposals for a grade-separated junction.

A44 Llangurig to Aberystwyth

Continued development of safety and resilience schemes aligned to the future road building tests

Economic development schemes

- A small sample of three land development schemes (Celtic Business Park, Fishguard; Llanfrechfa, Cwmbran; Warren Hall, Flintshire) were reviewed due to Welsh Government involvement via land ownership or funding.
- The Panel did not make recommendations on whether these individual schemes should proceed. Instead, the sample was used to inform the Panel's advice on future road investment.
- To aid implementation of these and other economic development schemes, we have asked Councillor Anthony Hunt and Councillor Llinos Medi to lead a group to develop guidance on delivering place based economic development enabled by transport solutions that support the growth of a prosperous, green, and equal economy and are consistent with the future tests for road building and the Wales Transport Strategy.

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
