Item 1: Minutes of the previous meeting

1.1 Cymeradwyodd y Cabinet gofnodion y 6 Tachwedd / Cabinet approved the minutes of 6 November.

Item 2: First Minister's items

UK government Cabinet reshuffle

2.1 Ministers noted that a UK government Cabinet reshuffle was taking place.

COVID-19 Inquiry

2.2 The First Minister reflected on the evidence that had been provided by Whitehall ministers, civil servants and special advisers to the COVID-19 Inquiry the previous week.

Item 3: Senedd business

3.1 Cabinet considered the Plenary Grid and noted that voting time was scheduled for 7:25pm on Tuesday and 6.25pm on Wednesday.

Item 4: Economic mission - priorities for a stronger economy

- 4.1 The Minister for Economy introduced the paper, which asked Cabinet to consider a draft of the Priorities for a Stronger Economy that had a focus on 4 National Priority Areas. Officials from across Government would need to support the deep dive work outlined in the paper.
- 4.2 The Economic mission, launched in 2021 set out an economic pathway to recovery from the pandemic. However, the impacts of Brexit and the war in Ukraine, coupled with the mini-budget, had brought limited economic growth and high inflation.
- 4.3 Therefore, there was now a need to develop and futureproof skills and business opportunities to increase potential across new and emerging areas, such as artificial intelligence and the transition to net zero. This would require a more strategic focus and a clearer narrative.
- 4.4 To achieve this there would now be 4 priority areas:
 - · a just transition and green prosperity
 - a platform for young people, fair work, skills and success
 - · stronger partnerships for stronger regions and the everyday economy, and
 - investing for growth.
- 4.5 Cabinet approved the paper.

Item 5: Impact of the UK government's Legislative Programme

- 5.1 The Counsel General and Minister for the Constitution introduced the briefing note, which outlined the UK Government's new legislative programme and its impact on the Welsh Government.
- 5.2 The King's speech and associated documentation set out 21 Bills, 6 of which had been carried over from the previous session. Six more had been introduced on 8 November.
