Over the past 10 years, there have been **22 on-farm deaths** involving a moving vehicle in Wales, with at least one death in each of the last ten years.

Moving vehicles are also responsible for a large number of serious, agricultural injuries — the most common types involving vehicles either reversing or overturning or people using quad bikes.

To prevent on-farm accidents and injury, follow the safety tips below:

- Ensure all loads are stable and secure.
- Only use lifting equipment fit for the job and operated by somebody who has the necessary training and expertise.
- Protect and mark all sharp or dangerous edges — covering or removing attachments on material handlers during road use.

- Head injuries are the most common cause of death from accidents involving quad bikes — wear a properly fitting, undamaged helmet at all times when riding a quad.

Make sure that you and your employees are adequately trained and competent to use machinery.
