Jobs and growth

Over the past decade we have made improvements in employment and productivity relative to the UK - but we can do more.

To support actions on jobs and growth we will measure:

Changes in the employment rate relative to the UK1

The employment rate in Wales is

3.74 percentage points

lower than the UK.

Changes in productivity relative to the UK²



Gross Valued Added (GVA) per hour worked in Wales is

93.3% of that in the UK (excluding London, the South East and East of England).

Percentage of skills gaps due to deficiencies in Welsh language skills³

28% **Oral Welsh** language skills

27% **Written Welsh** language skills

Financial sustainability

Since 2011 we have narrowed the gap in employer investment with the UK – but we can do more.

To ensure we deliver a skills system which is financially sustainable we will measure the gap between Wales and the UK in terms of employer investment in employee skills3



This measure will focus on ensuring that the Welsh Government is providing equality of opportunity for individuals with protected characteristics in accessing post-19 employment and skills support. It covers age, disability, ethnicity and gender.
