Executive summary

In August 2016 the Cabinet Secretary for Education announced the establishment of a task and finish group to review the activities of the Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol and to make recommendations on the way forward. The review would inform future policy and budget decisions regarding the Coleg.

As part of its terms of reference, the group explored the potential expansion of the remit of the Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol to include further education, in response to a commitment in Taking Wales Forward, the Welsh Government's programme for Government.

On 25 July 2017 year, the final report, *Review of the activities of the Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol* was published which included a total of 25 recommendations for consideration by the Welsh Government and the Coleg.

The Welsh Government sets out below its response to the Report's individual recommendations.

- establish a specialist planning board under the auspices of the Coleg, that will include representation from further education colleges, the work-based learning sector and Welsh Government, to develop an action plan to increase Welsh-medium provision within the post-16 sector;
- the planning board should prioritize three specific areas: supporting the current staff of colleges and training providers to develop their skills in order to teach bilingually, developing Welshmedium teaching resources, and promoting the opportunities and benefits for learners in the Welsh Government's priority areas, and;
- create a post-16 planning unit to support the work of the Planning Board and to respond to the new responsibilities.

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Further planning needs to be undertaken before the Coleg implements significant activities within the further education and work based learning sectors but activities where the Coleg has current influence, expertise and capacity will be immediately developed.

The Coleg will be tasked with establishing an advisory board with appropriate stakeholder representation to advise on priorities and interventions to ensure that future actions are aligned to the needs of learning providers, learners and employers.

An action plan will be developed jointly by the Welsh Government and the Coleg which will detail the immediate and longterm actions and interventions required to develop post-16 Welsh-medium provision.

The Coleg will consider how its internal processes and structure can support the advisory board, the development of an action plan and its future role within post-16 learning.
