One report has been produced to cover all marine SPA features in Wales. Following a quality assurance exercise by JNCC some minor changes were made to the reports. The reports are now awaiting internal sign-off within NRW before publication. This should be by the end of the calendar year. NRW provided an update on the next steps for the project, which include a review of approaches used elsewhere to provide site condition assessments and ways in which the process can be improved for the next iteration. 	3.
