

MFL STUDENT MENTORING PROJECT

97 secondary schools engaged over the first three years, reaching over 2,000 pupils.

18 schools took part in the pilot of the Digi-Languages e-mentoring platform. 43% of pupils who were e-mentored went on to opt for a GCSE in MFL.

Over 300 primary school pupils took part in one-day events and enrichment and extra-curricular sessions.

110 pupils explored connections between STEM, Languages and creativity at Oxford and Cardiff University.

ROUTES INTO LANGUAGES CYMRU

Language Ambassadors delivered 66 career talks, 9 classroom support sessions, 12 careers fairs across Wales attended.

OVER 300 pupil Language Ambassadors from Years 8/9 trained across the four consortia.

Lead schools are continuing to provide school to school classroom based training in Digital Literacy, which has improved teacher confidence in using tablets and other technology in the classroom.

Cardiff University provided additional exam specific support for AS learners:

73 learners from 12 schools 53 continuing onto A2 course.

This gives a continuation rate of 74%, substantially higher than the continuation rate nationally.
