NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE (WALES) ACT 2006

Directions to Local Health Boards in Wales and Public Health Wales National Health Service Trust

Made 28 March 2011

Coming into force 1 August 2011

The Welsh Ministers, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 12(3), 19(1), 203(9) and 204(3) of the National Health Service Act 2006(1), hereby give the following directions.

Commencement, application and interpretation

1.—(1) These Directions come into force on 1 August 2011 and apply to every Local Health Board in Wales and to Public Health Wales National Health Service Trust(2).

(2) In these Directions—

"the Child Measurement Programme for Wales" ("Rhaglen Mesur Plant Cymru") means the annual programme under which relevant children are weighed and measured in schools;

"reception year" ("blwyddyn dderbyn")means the school year in which the majority of the children are aged ether 4 or 5 years;

"relevant child" ("plentyn perthnasol") means a child in the reception year or year 4;

"year 4" ("blwyddyn 4") means the school year in which the majority of the children are aged either 8 or 9 years;

Co-operation for purpose of the Child Measurement Programme for Wales

- **2.**—(1) Each Local Health Board must co-operate with Public Health Wales National Health Service Trust to facilitate the performance and delivery of the Child Measurement Programme for Wales.
- (2) Public Health Wales National Health Service Trust must co-operate with Local Health Boards in Wales to facilitate the performance and delivery of the Child Measurement Programme for Wales.
