Reciprocal Healthcare Agreements

- 1. As you are aware the UK has reciprocal agreements with some non-EEA countries. Overseas visitors who can provide evidence that they are nationals, citizens or lawful residents of one of these countries should be treated as exempt from charges in respect of treatment which the relevant agreement entitles them to, whilst in the UK.
- 2. The following countries whose agreements were terminated on 1 January 2016:
 - Armenia
 - Azerbaijan
 - Belarus
 - Georgia
 - Kazakhstan
 - Kyrgyzstan
 - Moldova
 - Russia
 - Tajikistan
 - Turkmenistan
 - Ukraine
 - Uzbekistan
- 3. Anyone now seeking healthcare from the above countries should be charged for their treatment, unless they meet any of the exemption criteria as set out in the Overseas Visitor Hospital Charging Guidance 2015. The Department of Health in England is considering further potential changes to the remaining list of UK reciprocal agreements and we will notify you as soon as we are made aware of any further changes.
- 4. We will be issuing revised, updated Overseas Visitor Hospital Charging Guidance to reflect changes implemented since the existing guidance was issued. This will include the above changes to the list of reciprocal agreement countries. A draft of the revised guidance is currently with your respective overseas visitor managers for comment and to inform the final consultation document.
