Services Committee (Wales)
Directions 2009**

Made 6.00 p.m. on 1 October 2009

Coming into force 6.10 p.m. on 1 October
2009

The Welsh Ministers give the following Directions in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 12(1)(b) and (3), 13(2)(c), (3)(c) and (4)(c) and 203(9) and (10) of the National Health Service (Wales) Act 2006⁽¹⁾.

Title, commencement and application

1.—(1) The title of these Directions is the Welsh Health Specialised Services Committee (Wales) Directions 2009.

(2) These Directions come into force at 6.10 p.m. on 1 October 2009.

(3) These Directions are given to Local Health Boards and apply in relation to Wales.

Interpretation

2. In these Directions—

“the Act” (“*y Ddeddf*”) means the National Health Service (Wales) Act 2006;

“host Local Health Board” (“*Bwrdd Iechyd Lleol cynhaliol*”) means Cwm Taf Local Health Board;

“Local Health Board” (*“Bwrdd Iechyd Lleol”*) means a Local Health Board established in accordance with section 11(2) of the Act⁽¹⁾;

“operational date” (*“dyddiad gweithredol”*) means 1 April 2010;

“shadow period” (*“cyfnod cysgodol”*) means the period between 1 October 2009 and the operational date;

“the interim functions” (*“y swyddogaethau interim”*) means the functions listed in Annex 1 in so far as they are exercised by Welsh Ministers together with the planning and securing of the provision of any other specialised or tertiary services undertaken by them;

“the joint committee” (*“y cydbwyllgor”*) means the Welsh Health Specialised Services Committee established under direction 3;

“the relevant functions” (*“y swyddogaethau perthnasol”*) means the planning and securing of specialised and tertiary services which consist of the interim functions subject to any variations to those functions agreed from time to time by the joint committee; and

“Welsh health specialised services team” (*“tîm gwasanaethau iechyd arbenigol Cymru”*) means staff employed by the host Local Health Board to exercise the relevant functions from the operational date and to exercise preparatory functions in the shadow period.

Directions to each Local Health Board

3.—(1) The Local Health Boards will jointly exercise the relevant functions from the operational date.

(2) For the purpose of jointly exercising the relevant functions from the operational date the Local Health Boards will establish a joint committee from as soon as practicable after 1 October 2009.

(3) The Local Health Boards will not exercise the interim functions during the shadow period.

(4) The host Local Health Board will exercise its functions so as to provide administrative support for the running of the joint committee and establish the Welsh health specialised services team.

(1) Powys Teaching Local Health Board was established under the Local Health Boards (Establishment) (Wales) Order 2003 (S.I. 2003/148 (W.18)). Abertawe Bro Morgannwg University Local Health Board, Aneurin Bevan Local Health Board, Betsi Cadwaladr University Local Health Board, Cardiff and Vale University Local Health Board, Cwm Taf Local Health Board and Hywel Dda Local Health Board were established under the Local Health Boards (Establishment and Dissolution) (Wales) Order 2009 (S.I. 2009/778 (W.66)).

Limited functions of the joint committee during the shadow period

4. During the shadow period the Local Health Boards will secure that the joint committee established pursuant to direction 3(2) will take such decisions and make such arrangements as are reasonably necessary to enable it to perform the relevant functions satisfactorily from the operational date.

Membership of the joint committee

5.—(1) The members of the joint committee consist of the chief executive of each Local Health Board together with—

- (a) a chair;
- (b) a vice-chair selected from existing non-officer members of a Local Health Board;
- (c) two non-officer members selected from existing non-officer members of Local Health Boards; and
- (d) officer members.

(2) The officer members consist of—

- (a) a director of specialised and tertiary services;
- (b) a medical director of specialised and tertiary services;
- (c) a finance director of specialised and tertiary services; and
- (d) a nurse director of specialised and tertiary services.

(3) Officer members in paragraph (2) will have such responsibilities as may be prescribed by the joint committee.

(4) In addition there will be three associate members who will be the chief executives of Velindre National Health Service Trust, the Welsh Ambulance Services National Health Service Trust and the Public Health Wales National Health Service Trust. Associate members may not vote in any meetings or proceedings of the joint committee.

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| Clinical Immunology | Laboratory investigation for the diagnosis, clinical assessment and treatment of patients with suspected and established primary and humoral immunodeficiencies and the monitoring of complex therapies. |
| Commissioning of Specialised Services for Adults in respect of:— | |
| Cancer Services | Specialised services including Continuous Hyperfractionated Accelerated Radiotherapy (for lung cancer), Stereotactic radiosurgery, total skin electron beam radiotherapy cutaneous lymphoma only, micrographic surgery for skin cancer, thoracic surgery for the treatment of cancer, exenterative surgery for gynaecological cancer, brachytherapy, hyperthermia, radionuclide therapy, specialised palliative care services for common cancers: stents, laser and cryotherapy, photodynamic therapy, conformal radiotherapy, photopheresis, Positron Emission Tomography scanning, testing people for cancers that have genetic or familial associations including familial polyposis, hereditary non-polyposis, colon, breast. Specialised conditions including brain/central nervous system/spinal cancers, endocrine, sarcoma (soft tissue and bone), skin cancer (melanoma (any site)), cutaneous lymphoma, Human Immunodeficiency Virus related malignancies, mesothelioma, specialised gynaecological cancers—vulval, vaginal and germ cell cancers, head & neck cancers, haematological malignancies such as leukaemia, lymphoma and myeloma, urological cancers—complex bladder, retro-peritoneal surgery, testes, lymphnode section, complex penile; pituitary tumours and teenage & young adult cancer (up to age 25). |
| Complex rehabilitation for brain injury and complex disability | Centres providing a significant proportion of complex rehabilitation—excluding local aftercare and rehabilitation. |
| Neurosciences | Neurosurgery; Neurology (excluding in-patient stroke and cerebral haemorrhage); |

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| | Neurorehabilitation; Neuropathology; Neurophysiology; Neuroradiology; Neuroophthalmology; Neurootology. |
| Renal services | Treatment for End Stage Renal Failure; Treatment for acute renal failure; General nephrology (provided in a main nephrology unit); Renal related surgery including dialysis. |
| Home parental nutrition | Home care packages and support provided by hospital team. |
| Cardiology and cardiac surgery | Cardiothoracic transplantation (including implantable ventricular assist devices); Pulmonary hypertension; Cardiac electrophysiology; Congenital heart disease; Invasive cardiology; Angiography and cardiac surgery. |
| Infectious diseases | Inpatient infectious disease activity. |
| Hepatology, hepatobiliary and pancreatic surgery | Services for the treatment of patients with viral hepatitis; Services for patients with acute liver failure and advanced complications of cirrhosis; Services for patients with benign and malignant liver tumours and cancer of the intra and extrahepatic biliary tree (including pancreas); Hepatobiliary and pancreatic surgery. |
