Basis of Judgement

This judgement is designed to provide the Registered Social Landlord, its tenants, service users and other stakeholders with an understanding of its financial viability and how well it is performing, at a specific moment in time, in relation to:

- Governance and Service Delivery
- Financial Management

The judgement must not be relied upon by any other party for any other purpose. The Registered Social Landlord is responsible for the completeness and accuracy of information provided to the Regulator.

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Profile

Wales & West Housing Association ("Wales & West Housing" or "the Group") provides homes and services to more than 22,000 people. Working in 15 local authority areas, the Group has approximately 12,000 homes, owned or managed.

Wales & West Housing has over 660 staff and offices in Cardiff, Ewloe and Newcastle Emlyn. The Group was founded in 1965. It is registered in England and Wales with charitable rules and under the Co-operative and Community Benefit Societies Act 2014.

Wales & West Housing has four subsidiaries:

- Cambria Maintenance Services Limited, providing repairs, maintenance and improvements to all Wales & West Housing homes.
- Castell Ventures Limited providing catering, cleaning and care and support services to Wales & West Housing service users and others.
- Enfys Developments Ltd, providing development agent services internally.
- Castell Homes Ltd, providing homes for sale.

Current cash balances and undrawn facilities are sufficient for the Group to complete its committed development programme.

*2018 performance reflects exceptional items of £8.5m, comprising an increase in the pension provision following a triennial valuation (£4.4m), breakage costs from the repayment of housing loans (£3.5m) and impairment charges (£0.6m). Exceptional items in 2017 amounted to £0.6m.
