The A487 Trunk Road (Tre Taliesin, Ceredigion) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 201-

Made 201-Coming into force 201-

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A487 Fishguard to Bangor Trunk Road (hereinafter referred to as "the trunk road"), in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2) and 4(2) to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) (hereinafter referred to as "the 1984 Act"), and after consultation with the Chief Officer of the Dyfed-Powys Police hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order comes into force on **** 201-. The title to this Order is the A487 Trunk Road (Tre Taliesin, Ceredigion) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 201-.

2. (1) In this Order –

"disabled person's badge" ("bathodyn person anabl") has the meaning given in Regulation 2 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Wales) Regulations 2000(2).

"parking disc" ("disg barcio") has the meaning given in Regulation 8(5) of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000(3).

- (2) For the purposes of this Order a vehicle is regarded as displaying:-
 - (i) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if:-
 - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part

1 of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle, or

- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position in or on the vehicle so that Part 1 of the badge is clearly legible from outside the vehicle; and
- (ii) a parking disc in the relevant position if:-
 - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel the disc is exhibited on it so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is clearly legible from outside the vehicle; or
 - (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position in or on the vehicle so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is clearly legible from outside the vehicle.
- (3) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- 3. Save as provided in article 4, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable, police community support officer, traffic officer or civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of the lengths of the trunk road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 4. (1) Nothing in article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of the lengths of the trunk road specified in the Schedule to this Order for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from a vehicle:
 - (b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-

- i. building, industrial or demolition operations;
- ii. the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- iii. the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road; or
- iv. the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said lengths of the trunk road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telegraphic line as defined in the Communications Act 2003(4);
- (d) the vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (e) the vehicle to take petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of the trunk road;
- (f) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes; or
- (g) the vehicle stopping when the person in control of it;
 - i. is required by law to stop;
 - ii. is obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident; or
 - iii. is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control.
- (2) Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began), to wait on any of the sides of the lengths of the trunk road referred to therein for a period not exceeding 3 hours, being a period separated by an interval of at least one hour from any previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same day on any of those sides of the specified lengths of the trunk road.

Lengths of the A487 Trunk Road at Tre Taliesin in the County of Ceredigion.

The western side of that length of the A487 trunk road from a point 9 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the C1094 to Llancynfelyn to a point 24 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the C1094 to Llancynfelyn.

The western side of that length of the A487 trunk road from a point 25 metres south of the centreline of its junction with the urban unclassified road known as Chapel Street to a point 15 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the urban unclassified road known as Chapel Street.

The western side of that length of the A487 trunk road from a point 36 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the urban unclassified road known as Chapel Street to a point 69 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the urban unclassified road known as Chapel Street.

The eastern side of that length of the A487 trunk road from a point 8 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the private access to Llys-y-Coed to a point 275 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the private access to Llys-y-Coed.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Welsh Ministers propose to make an Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2), and 4(2) to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the proposed Order will be to prohibit waiting on the sides of the lengths of the A487 Fishguard to Bangor Trunk Road (hereinafter referred to as "the trunk road") at Tre Taliesin in the County of Ceredigion, as described in the Schedule to this Notice.

The western side of that length of the A487 trunk road from a point 9 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the C1094 to Llancynfelyn to a point 24 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the C1094 to Llancynfelyn.

The western side of that length of the A487 trunk road from a point 25 metres south of the centreline of its junction with the urban unclassified road known as Chapel Street to a point 15 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the urban unclassified road known as Chapel Street.

The western side of that length of the A487 trunk road from a point 36 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the urban unclassified road known as Chapel Street to a point 69 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the urban unclassified road known as Chapel Street.

The eastern side of that length of the A487 trunk road from a point 8 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the private access to Llys-y-Coed to a point 275 metres north of the centreline of its junction with the private access to Llys-y-Coed.
