- Mae'r prosiect yn cael ei gynnal o Ionawr 2019 tan ddiwedd 2020
- Mae tri phrif allbwn i'r prosiect:
 - Dadansoddiad o'r drefn lywodraethu aml-lefel bresennol yng Nghymru
 - Datblygu pecyn adnodd er mwyn gweithredu i hybu'r capaciti cyllidol ac ariannol ar gyfer datblygu rhanbarthol a buddsoddi mewn seilwaith.
 - Dwy seminar gyda rhanddeiliaid perthnasol.
- Project runs from January 2019 – end of 2020
- The project has three main outputs:
 - An analysis of the current Welsh multi-level governance system
 - Development of a toolkit for action to support the fiscal and financial capacity for regional development and infrastructure investment.
 - Two seminars with relevant stakeholders.

- Ebrill 2019 – cyflwynodd Llywodraeth Cymru'r arolwg cychwynnol i'r OECD – yn cynnwys mewnbwn gan sefydliadau partner (nid dim ond barn LIC)
- Ionawr 2019 – Ymweliad astudio OECD â Chymru
 - Cynnal cyfarfodydd gyda Gweinidogion, rhanddeiliaid amrywiol, y grŵp llywio allanol a swyddogion y llywodraeth.
- Gorffennaf – darparu gwybodaeth ddilynol i'r OECD.
- April 2019 - Welsh Government submitted the initial survey to the OECD – included input from partner organisations (not just WG views).
- June 2019 – OECD Study Mission to Wales.
 - Meetings held with Ministers, various stakeholders, the external steering group and government officials.
- July – Follow up information provided to the OECD.

Study Mission

- 22 o gyfarfodydd wedi'u cynnal.
- Cynrychiolwyr o ystod eang o sefydliadau allanol a grwpiau ambarél ac adrannau Llywodraeth.
- Ymgysylltu da iawn gan yr holl randdeiliaid a gymerodd ran – trafodaethau agored a gonest.
- Gwybodaeth ychwanegol wedi'i rhoi i'r OECD ar ôl yr ymweliad.
- 22 meetings held.
- Representatives from a wide cross section of external organisations, umbrella groups and Government departments.
- Very good engagement from all stakeholders who took part – open and honest discussions.
- Following the visit additional information has been passed to the OECD.

 - Cyflwyno'r pecyn adnodd drafft i randdeiliaid, ddiwedd Ch2 – haf 2020
 - Adroddiad terfynol, Ch1 2021.
- Exact timings are still being discussed:
 - Initial findings to Welsh Government Q3 - autumn 2019
 - Seminar to input to analytical study and case study Q4 - late autumn 2019
 - Preliminary recommendations and case study presented late Q4 – Winter 2019/20
 - Seminar to test preliminary recommendations End Q1 – Spring 2020
 - Present draft toolkit to stakeholders End Q2 – Summer 2020
 - Final report Q1 2021.
