ROAD TRAFFIC

THE TRUNK ROADS (VARIOUS STREETS, FISHERGATE)
(PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 1965

The Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under sections 26(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Act 1960(a), as read with the Secretary of State for Wales and Minister of Land and Natural Resources Order 1963(b), and all other powers his enabling in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:-

1. Save as provided in Article 2 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.0 a.m. and 6.0 p.m.:-

- (a) in any of the lengths of road or on the side of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order; or
- (b) on the side of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order:
 - (i) for a longer period than 1 hour; or
 - (ii) if a period of less than 1 hour has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle on that side.

2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road or on either of the sides of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary:-

- (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
- (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle;
- (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of road or of either of the sides of road so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near any of the said lengths of road or either of the said sides of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1876(a);
- (d) to enable the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; or
- (e) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road.

3. The Interpretation Act 1953(d) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the 21st October 1965, and may be cited as "The Trunk Roads (Various Streets, Fishguard) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1965".

SCHEDULE 1

Lengths and sides of the London - Fishguard Trunk Road (A.140), known as High Street, The Square and West Street, in the Urban District of Fishguard and Gosholm in the County of Pembrokeshire

1. That length, known as High Street, The Square and West Street, which lies between a point in High Street 155 yards south-east of The Square and a point in West Street 140 yards north-west of The Square.
2. That length, known as West Street, which lies between a point 210 yards north-west of The Square and a point 330 yards north-west of The Square.
3. The north-east side of that length, known as West Street, which lies between a point 140 yards north-west of The Square and a point 210 yards north-west of The Square.

That length of the Fishguard - Aberystwyth - Dolgelly - Casnewydd - Bangor (Banc Suspension Bridge) Trunk Road (A.147), known as Main Street in the Urban District of Fishguard and Gosholm in the County of Pembrokeshire, which lies between The Square and a point 215 yards east of The Square.

SCHEDULE 2

The south-west side of that length of the London - Fishguard Trunk Road (A.140), known as West Street in the Urban District of Fishguard and Gosholm in the County of Pembrokeshire, which lies between a point 140 yards north-west of The Square and a point 210 yards north-west of The Square.
