JS welcomed everyone to the eighth meeting of the Homelessness Action Group and apologies were noted.

The purpose of this meeting was to consider the draft report setting out the recommendations for question one – the overall framework of policies and approaches to end homelessness.

The existing draft report was considered in terms of whether the recommendations need to be revised, amended or strengthened. The group also considered: prioritising the recommendations into either short, medium and long term aims, or pace of delivery; strengthening the introduction section; adding further detail about the Welsh Government's existing welfare powers; adding further detail about cultural change and extending public service prevention activity from the statutory 56-day point; the

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(financial) scale of the investment needed; more emphasis on early intervention & prevention; requirement for accountability against delivery on ending homelessness.

The report will also consider how a faster response time could be considered by health care professionals in instances for when people are unwell (ie mental health issues) to avoid evicting into homelessness, and that pathways are fully considered and necessary interventions referenced (ie for prison leavers, care leavers).

It was agreed that some of the recommendations will specify the mechanism or delivery vehicle required to implement the recommendation, whilst others may need to state that a mechanism will need to be found.

Following the group discussion, where the Group agreed a consensus on the drafting of the recommendations, the next stage is that the report will be completed and presented to the Minister for Housing & Local Government in February but will still be considered to be a draft report until the lived experience work has been completed and added. The lived experience workshops will be completed by mid to late February.
