How to Complete a Paper Logbook:

A quick guide to the main information required on paper logbooks

1

Departure details

- Must be completed before you leave port on every trip, even if not fishing
- Must declare date, time and port of departure
- Must declare all gear and catch on board at time of departure
- Must show the correct information for the master for the trip (full name and address)

Daily fishing activity information

- Must be completed every day on all fishing trips before 23:59 – even if there is no catch to declare
- Must complete a new line for each day and when crossing / entering / exiting effort zones
- **Must detail¹:** date, number of fishing operations, sea area of capture (including statistical rectangle)
- Must record catch as per 'catch information'
- A new logsheet must be completed when using multiple gear types on one trip

Catch information

- Must declare all catch on board over 50kg live weight
- Must record what has been returned to the sea (discarded)
- Must record undersize fish in accordance with the landing obligation
- **For all species, you must declare:** Species code, Unit weight, Total number of units/total weight retained
- All weights should be declared in kg live weight

Return to Port information

- Must be completed when you return to port on every trip
- Must declare date, time and port of return
- If you are landing into a designated port, your completed logsheet(s) should be deposited in the Logbook post box, or handed to a Marine Enforcement Officer, prior to landing your catch.

¹ Depending on where and how you fish, there may be other information you are required to submit with your logbook, for instance fishing depth or gear dimensions. Landing Declaration

- Must be completed for all trips where catch was landed
- Must be submitted within 48h of the landing operation
- Can be completed by the master or his representative
- Must detail date, time and port of landing (if different from return to port)
- Must detail all species and quantities landed – even if not sold
- Below minimum size catches must be recorded separately
