Thank you for your request which I received on 25 January 2021. You asked for the following information:

- How many deaths that had Covid 19 on the death certificate were registered in Wales from January the 1st to December the 31st 2020?
- How many of these deaths occurred in people under the age of 65?
- How many deaths occurred in Wales with Covid only on the Death certificate in the under 65's age group?

Welsh Government does not hold this information.

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) collect and produce mortality statistics for England and Wales based on information from the death registration process. They publish [weekly](#) statistics on deaths involving Covid-19 (i.e. Covid-19 was mentioned on the death certificate as a contributory cause of death) and [monthly](#) statistics on deaths due to Covid-19 (i.e. where Covid-19 was identified as the underlying (main) cause on the death certificate). They have also published summary statistics on deaths involving Covid-19 by [age group](#). For further information on this data, please contact the ONS at health.data@ons.gov.uk
