ATISN 15621 - Specific School set exam papers data

Thank you for your request which I received on 25 October. You asked for information on exams set and taken at GCSE and A Level at Ysgol Bro Hyddgen in Powys specifically for 2017 Exam paper data; 2018 Exam paper data; and 2019 Exam paper data, including the Welsh Exam Board data for this school and numbers of exam papers taken in each language stream. You also asked for data on exam papers provided to the school, exam papers 'sat/taken' and results in each language and each subject at A Level and GCSE.

In addition, you asked for data on the total number of papers delivered to the school in both languages and any other available data on admissions and language streams within Ysgol Bro Hyddgen.

I have established that the information you require is not held by the Welsh Government. Instead, I suggest that you direct your request to the WJEC as they will have the information about qualification entries and outcomes at a school and subject level, this can be done via the following link: [Useful Contacts \(wjec.co.uk\)](#). You could also try your Local Authority, contactable at [Make a Freedom of Information request \(or EIR\) - Powys County Council](#).

The request you sent me contains personal information about you - for example, your name and address. The Welsh Government will be the data processor for this information and, in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation, it will be processed in order to fulfil our public task and meet our legal obligations under the Act to provide you with a response. We will only use this personal information to deal with your request and any matters which arise as a result of it. We will keep your

personal information and all other information relating to your request for three years from the date on which your request is finally closed. Your personal information will then be disposed of securely.

Under data protection legislation, you have the right:

- to be informed of the personal data we hold about you and to access it
- to require us to rectify inaccuracies in that data
- to (in certain circumstances) object to or restrict processing
- for (in certain circumstances) your data to be 'erased'
- to (in certain circumstances) data portability
- to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) who is our independent regulator for data protection
