

The Wales Procurement Policy Statement 2021 – Welsh Government's Action Plan

Welsh public sector procurement is a powerful lever with ability to affect sustained change to achieve social, economic, environmental and cultural outcomes for the well-being of Wales.

Welsh Government Procurement will observe the following Wales Procurement Policy Statement (WPPS) principles when working towards Welsh Government policy commitments, as set out below:
