What is the National Conversation?

- Welsh Government want to ensure that the advice, guidance, support and programmes that are currently available to young people are suitable.
- To help us to understand what can be done better, we want to hear from young people all across Wales from all backgrounds.
- This will help us to improve what is offered so that all young people can easily access advice, guidance, support and programmes that are suitable for them.

What is the Young Person's Guarantee?

- The Young Person's Guarantee is a new commitment made by the Welsh Government to ensure that there is no lost generation in Wales following the Covid-19 pandemic.
- The YPG will guarantee an offer of support to young people to gain a place in education or training, or help to get into work or become self-employed.
- The guarantee is for every child or young person aged between 16 and 25 who lives in Wales.

In May 2022, Welsh Government will launch the National Conversation with Young People.

To help us to understand what can be done better, we want to hear from young people all across Wales from all backgrounds.

This will help us to improve what is offered so that all young people can easily access advice, guidance, support and programmes that are suitable for them.

Our promise to you



- **We will listen to what you have to say.** Welsh Government want to improve the services we offer to young people so that every young person has an opportunity to succeed. We can only do this by listening to what young people have to say.
- **We will consider your views.** Once the information from the focus groups that are taking place has been collected, a report will be produced outlining what young people have told us. Welsh Government will use young people's views from this report to consider how we can make changes to existing programmes and services.
- **We will feed back to you to let you know how you have helped us to shape new provision.** Once we have considered what changes we might be able to make, we will consult with groups of young people so that they can help us to make sure the changes meet the requirements of young people. We won't be collecting your personal details so we won't be able to feed back to you directly, but we will feed back to your group facilitator who can let you know how your views have helped to influence changes here at Welsh Government.

About the information that is collected

The person leading your group chat (who we are calling the 'facilitator') may collect some information about you, such as your age or your disability status. This kind of information is really useful to Welsh Government when they are considering what changes they can make that may help different groups of young people.

Any information collected is anonymous. This means that we will not know any of your personal information such as your name or address. None of your personal information will be processed.

You can, of course, choose not to share this information and that is not a problem; we would still like you to take part in the conversation

When the facilitator returns the information to us and to an organisation called Golley Slater, that is helping us with the national conversation, all of the information is anonymous. The information will be summarised and no personal data shared with us.
