

Initial Teacher Education (ITE) Priority Subject incentive scheme 2022

Education Wales 2022 No. WG22-23.

Background

1. The Welsh Ministers have powers under sections 14-17 of the Education Act 2002 to provide financial assistance to any person for or in connection with enabling a person to receive training for teachers or for non-teaching staff, the promotion of the recruitment of teachers or non-teaching staff and the remuneration of, or provision of other benefits to, teachers or non-teaching staff. The Initial Teacher Education (ITE) Priority Subject Incentive Scheme (“this Scheme”) is made in the exercise of those powers.
2. This Scheme comes into effect on 1 September 2022 and applies in relation to Wales. This Scheme replaces the Teacher Training Incentive Scheme 2021 (WG20-62) (“the 2021 Scheme”).
 - I. The provisions of the 2021 Scheme will continue to apply to those whose programme commenced on or after 1 September 2021 but prior to 1 September 2022.
 - II. The provisions of the 2020 Scheme will continue to apply to those whose programme commenced on or after 1 September 2020 but prior to 1 September 2021.
 - III. The provisions of the 2019 Scheme will continue to apply to those whose programme commenced on or after 1 September 2019 but prior to 1 September 2020.
 - IV. The provisions of the 2018 Scheme will continue to apply to those whose programme commenced on or after 1 September 2018 but prior to 1 September 2019.
 - V. The provisions of the 2017 Scheme will continue to apply to those whose programme commenced on or after 1 September 2017 but prior to 1 September 2018.
3. The Welsh Ministers, under section 10 of the Education Act 1996 (which imposes a duty upon the Welsh Ministers to promote the education of the people of Wales), issue this non-statutory guidance on the Scheme to assist students and providers of accredited ITE programmes who exercise any function under this Scheme.

Summary of this Scheme

4. In exercise of the Welsh Ministers’ powers under sections 14-17 of the Education Act 2002, this Scheme makes provision for the Welsh Ministers to pay grants by way of incentives to eligible persons undertaking an eligible postgraduate ITE programme to gain Qualified Teacher Status in Wales in specified subjects. Under sections 15 and 16 of the Education Act 2002, such financial assistance may be given in any form and on such terms as the Welsh Ministers think appropriate. The Welsh Ministers have the absolute power to determine which programmes and subjects are eligible under this Scheme. The decision of the Welsh Ministers as to whether any payment under this Scheme will be made to any eligible person is final.
5. The Welsh Ministers will determine the number of instalments and when instalments will be paid to eligible persons. Payment of the incentive grant will usually be divided into three instalments: the first instalment may be paid during an eligible accredited ITE programme (in-programme instalment), the second after the eligible person has

successfully achieved Qualified Teacher Status (QTS instalment) and the third when the person has satisfactorily completed induction (final instalment).

Interpretation

6. Except where the context otherwise requires, for the purpose of this Scheme:

“accredited postgraduate teacher training programme” (*“rhaglen hyfforddi athrawon ôl-raddedig achredig”*) means a programme accredited by the Education Workforce Council’s Teacher Education Accreditation Board¹ established pursuant to regulation 5 of the Education Workforce Council (Accreditation of Initial Teacher Training) (Wales) Regulations 2017;

“employed” (*“cyflogedig”*) means employed under a contract of employment or engaged to provide services otherwise than under a contract of employment and “employment” (*“cyflogaeth”*) shall be construed accordingly;

“employment-based teacher training scheme” (*“cynllun hyfforddi athrawon ar sail cyflogaeth”*) means a scheme made under regulation 8 of the School Teachers’ Qualifications (Wales) Regulations 2012, including any amended or replacement scheme;

“qualified teacher” (*“athro cymwysedig neu athrawes gymwysedig”*) has the meaning given to it by section 132(1) of the Education Act 2002: that is to say “a person who satisfies requirements specified in regulations”² made under that section;

“postgraduate ITE programme ” (*“cwrs ôl-raddedig o hyfforddiant athrawon”*) means an accredited full-time, part-time or flexible postgraduate programme of initial teacher education which is provided at an institution in Wales. In this context “flexible” indicates that the length and pattern of the programme is determined by reference to the student’s experience and training requirements.

Incentive grants

7. The Welsh Ministers may, in their absolute discretion, pay grants under this paragraph (“incentive grants”) by way of incentives to persons who satisfy the requirements of paragraphs 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13, subject to paragraph 8.

8. Grants made available under this Scheme are subject to the conditions set out in paragraphs 14 to 20

9. To be eligible for an incentive grant, a person must: -

(a) be studying wholly or mainly one or more of the following priority subjects or phases on an eligible postgraduate secondary ITE programme: Biology,

Chemistry, Design & Technology, Information Technology, Mathematics, Modern Foreign Languages (MFL), Physics and/or Welsh; and

- (b) hold at entry to the eligible postgraduate secondary ITE programme a first degree or equivalent qualification awarded by a United Kingdom institution, or an equivalent degree or other qualification awarded by a foreign institution, of a 1st, 2.1 or 2.2 classification, or a PhD or Masters or equivalent. The first degree or equivalent qualification is not required to be in the same subject as that undertaken on the postgraduate ITE programme.

Eligibility for training grants

10. To be eligible for each payment instalment of the incentive grant, a person must meet the individual criteria at each payment point as detailed below.
11. To be eligible for an incentive grant **in-programme** payment instalment, a person must:-
- (a) be undertaking an eligible postgraduate ITE programme in Wales which commences on or after 1 September 2022 but prior to 1 September 2023;
 - (b) be an eligible student who qualifies for financial support under regulations currently in force made under section 22 of the Teaching and Higher Education Act 1998 as they apply to that course³;
 - (c) not already be a qualified teacher;
 - (d) not be employed to teach at a school or other institution as a teacher on entry to their eligible postgraduate ITE programme as per 9(a) above;
 - (e) not be a participant in training organised under an employment-based teacher training scheme, including the Salaried PGCE;
 - (f) not be undertaking a further education course of any kind;
12. To be eligible for an incentive grant **QTS** payment instalment, on completion of an ITE programme and on award of QTS, a student must:
- I. meet the eligibility requirements for the priority subject grant and have received all the eligible in-programme incentive payments during their ITE programme
 - II. have successfully completed an eligible ITE programme and obtained QTS in accordance with the School Teachers' Qualifications (Wales) Regulations 2012
13. To be eligible for an incentive grant **final** payment instalment, on completion of induction, a NQT must:

- I. have met the eligibility requirements for the priority subject grant and have received all the eligible in-programme and QTS incentive payments during their ITE programme and on award of QTS
- II. have successfully completed Induction and awarded an Induction certificate within three years of award of QTS, in any maintained secondary setting in Wales, as required under the Education (Induction Arrangements for School Teachers) (Wales) Regulations 2015.

Conditions

14. No grant will be paid under paragraph 7 to a person unless he or she has made an application to the Welsh Ministers in such form, at such time and containing such particulars as the Welsh Ministers may from time to time determine.
15. The Welsh Ministers may at their discretion decide not to pay an incentive grant to persons accepted onto a postgraduate ITE programme where the intake target for that programme has been reached (as determined by the Education Workforce Council).
16. A person who is eligible for an incentive grant and joins a postgraduate ITE programme, but leaves their programme before its completion, or fails to be awarded QTS or satisfactorily complete induction, as applicable, will not be eligible to receive any further grant instalments over and above those already paid to the person, in accordance with any guidance and payment schedule produced by the Welsh Ministers from time to time.
17. Incentive grants (whether in-programme, QTS or final) which may be due to eligible persons who started an eligible programme in one academic year but then, following a deferral, resumed the programme in the next academic year. will continue to be paid at the applicable incentive grant rate (if any) under the Scheme which applied in the academic year that their studies initially started unless the Welsh Ministers decide otherwise in their discretion in writing.
18. Where a person eligible under this Scheme has, prior to 1 September 2022, received, in either full or in part, any incentive grant payments under any other schemes or arrangements in connection with undertaking initial teacher education, the grant payments due to them under this Scheme will be reduced by an amount corresponding to the grant payments previously received by them under those other schemes or arrangements. This also applies to grants received by eligible persons prior to 1 September 2022 under any arrangements applying in England which the Welsh Ministers are satisfied correspond to those made in respect of incentive grants in pursuance of this Scheme.
19. Outstanding payments for students who withdraw from an ITE programme, not achieved QTS or failed to start or complete their induction period may be withheld, in accordance with any guidance and payment schedule produced by the Welsh Ministers from time to time.
20. The Welsh Ministers may require any grant paid under paragraph 7 to be repaid in whole or in part if:-

- (a) after receiving any instalment of an incentive grant, the recipient fails to meet any eligibility criteria in relation to a subsequent instalment;
- (b) the recipient has provided in, or in connection with, his or her application for an incentive grant, information which is false or materially misleading;
- (c) there is evidence that the recipient had never intended to complete their ITE Programme or, having completed it, to enter teaching.


Payment of grant

- 21. Incentive grants under paragraph 7 may be paid in such instalment amounts and at such times as the Welsh Ministers may determine.
- 22. The Welsh Ministers will provide funds to an institution which provides an eligible accredited postgraduate Initial Teacher Education programme, at such times as the Welsh Ministers may determine, for payment to an eligible person on an eligible postgraduate ITE programme.
- 23. The Welsh Ministers will provide funds to the Education Workforce Council, at such times as the Welsh Ministers may determine, for payment to an eligible person, such times to be after the eligible person has successfully completed their induction.

Administration

- 24. The Welsh Ministers may make a payment to institutions providing accredited postgraduate ITE programmes that receive funds under paragraph 22 in recognition of the administrative and other associated costs related to making payments under those paragraphs. The institutions will be required as part of any such payment to have regard to any guidance issued by the Welsh Ministers (referred to in paragraph 3).
- 25. The Welsh Ministers may provide the Education Workforce Council with a payment in recognition of the administrative and other associated costs related to making payments under paragraph 23. The Education Workforce Council will be required as part of any such payment to have regard to any guidance issued by the Welsh Ministers (referred to in paragraph 3).
