Request for Information – ATISN 16991

Thank you for your request for information which I received on 19 December. I apologise for the delay in responding to you.

Your Request

You have asked for the following information:

1. The total number of fines issued between junctions 24 and 28 of the M4 by Welsh Government's new 50mph cameras since they were switched on on Thursday, November 17. The locations for reduced speed limits to 50mph are on the A494 between the Wales/England border and St David's Interchange Deeside, the A483 between junctions 5 and 6 Wrexham, M4 between junctions 41 and 42 Port Talbot, M4 between junctions 25 and 26 Newport, and A470 between Upper Boat and Pontypridd.
2. The total value of fines issued to those recorded speeding in those areas since that date.
3. The total number of fines issued which have been paid.
4. The total number of fines issued which have not been paid.
5. The total value of fines issued which have been paid.
6. The total value of fines issued which have not been paid.
7. The total number of advisory notices issued by Welsh Government to drivers exceeding the 50mph limit in these areas since November 17.
