Request for Information - ATISN 17332

I wrote to you on 6 April regarding your request for information.

Your request

You requested the following information:

- 1) the readings of emissions for the Bryn Glas tunnel section of the M4 prior to the implementation of the 50mph speed limit coming into place whilst it was still 70mph and
- 2) our latest survey carried out whilst it changed into 50mph

I can confirm we hold the information you have requested. I have concluded, however, that it is exempt from disclosure under Section 21 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, information otherwise available.

The 50mph speed limit came into force in June 2018.
