Information requested

Thank you for your request which I received on 17 April 2023. You asked for:

The amount of money spent on the safer a 20mph campaign, to include:

- Planning
- Advertising
- Staff hours
- o Banners for lampposts
- New Road signage
- New Road markings.

Our response

We do not hold the information for total spend that you have requested, because staff hours in Welsh Government are not recorded against specific activities. Nevertheless, the direct financial cost of implementing the policy change to default speed limits on restricted roads in Wales from 30mph to 20mph is estimated to be around £32 million.

We do hold figures for some of the breakdown you have requested.

Planning and advertising

The Welsh Government has commissioned a contract for the 20mph public information, communications and marketing campaign, incurred across the financial years of 2022-23 and 2023-24, for a total value of £810,690. The spend against this to date is £342,346.64.

Signage and markings

The total cost for changes to traffic signs and road markings to date is £3,502,362.
