### Request for Information – ATISN 18636

Thank you for your request for information dated 22 June.

### Information requested

1. What analysis has been done in terms of the cost to change speed limits to 20mph following the Welsh Government's introduction of a default 20mph speed limit on roads in Wrexham?
2. Could you also please provide itemised costs for the 20mph change, i.e. signage, road markings, and so on.

### Our response

We do not hold the information relating to analysis or itemised costs in Wrexham, this information would be held by Wrexham County Borough Council. They can be contacted at [Contact | Wrexham County Borough Council](#).

Last financial year Wrexham claimed £35,399.15 towards 20mph implementation, broken down as follows:

This year they requested £361,500 grant funding this financial year, broken down to:

TRO Costs £32,500, Signs £230,000, Communications £10,000, Other e.g. Costs of 30mph exceptions £89,000. To date we have not processed any claims for payment.
