Dear Colleagues,

In January, the Centre for Perioperative Care (CPOC) launched the <u>National</u> <u>Safety Standards for Invasive Procedures (NatSSIPS2)</u>.

An invasive procedure is described as "...a procedure that is performed where a hole or incision is made in a patient or via a patient orifice and usually where a documented consent is required." The standards cover invasive procedures in all settings, including outpatients and primary care and introduces the concept of checks for major and minor procedures.

NatSSIPs2 have been developed in collaboration across the four UK nations and replace the 2015 NatSSIPs introduced in <u>Patient Safety Notice PSN034</u>. The NHS Wales Executive will **not** be issuing a new Patient Safety Notice since the actions required in PSN034 are equally applicable to NatSSIPs2.

Please note, although NatSSIPS2 have been developed collaboratively, there are some references to policies specific to NHS England, but which have equivalents for NHS Wales, as follows:
