Thank you for your request for information dated 24 August.

Information requested

- The full cost of reducing speed limits to 20mph in Wales
- How much of this cost has been spent in each tax year and any future projected

Our response

Please see the attached link – In the <u>Regulatory Impact Assessment</u> undertaken in 2022 it was estimated that the total cost of traffic regulation orders by highway authorities, for exceptions to the 20mph default speed limit, will be £1.1 million. We do not have a figure for the number of signs that will be involved, this information is held by each individual highway authority. The estimated cost for changes to traffic signs and road markings is £26.7 million.

Although we don't have the total costs per local authority, we have previously published grant funding provided to local authorities broken down by year: <u>ATISN</u> <u>18768 .pdf (gov.wales)</u>
