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
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1. Introduction

We have developed a DEWi management report that is automatically generated when the post-16 collection file is uploaded to DEWi (when the school uploads a file that passes the schema and has no storage failures). The report calculates school-level figures that feed directly into the calculation of the new post-16 achievement measures, so should be used by Heads of Sixth Form and data contacts at local authorities to assist in validating the data.



The data in the table below should match with the information provided as part of the spreadsheets submitted for planning and funding purposes.





2.2 Welsh Baccalaureate learning activities – Year 13

The table below shows the number of learners in <u>Year 13</u> that have been recorded as undertaking any post-16 Skills Challenge Certificate and Welsh Baccalaureate learning activities (split by level) and the % that are recorded as having completed them.


For the Advanced Welsh Baccalaureate this is the second year.



We would expect there to be an equal number of Welsh Baccalaureate and Skills Challenge Certificate activities as schools are required to record both (see section 9 – page 19) of the <u>technical completion notes</u>.

2.3 Welsh Baccalaureate learning activities – Year 12

The data in the table below shows the number of learners in <u>Year 12</u> that have been recorded as undertaking any post-16 Skills Challenge Certificate and Welsh Baccalaureate learning activities (split by level) and the % that are recorded as having completed them.



Within the Advanced Welsh Baccalaureate, the Skills Challenge Certificate is recorded as a two year learning activity. At the end of Year 12 the activity should be recorded as 'continuing' unless the learner has withdrawn.

Therefore you would expect your 'continuing rate' to be 100% unless you have any learners that have withdrawn.



2.4 General Education programme completion rates for 3+ AS level

The data in the table below should broadly equate to the number of learners undertaking 3+ AS level (or equivalent) programmes in the given academic year.


This data will be used to identify the cohort of learners for the 2022/23 measures (i.e. year one of the two-year 2022/23 measure).

If the completion rate is lower than expected, check that any learning programmes that have that have been completed are recorded as such. NB some learning programmes contain learning activities which span two years. In these cases the programme should be recorded as 'completed' but the activities should be recorded as 'continuing'.




2.5 General Education programme completion rates for A2 level

The data in the table below should broadly equate to the number of learners undertaking A2 level (or equivalent) programmes in the given academic year.



2.6 Vocational programme completion rates

The data in the table below should show the number of purely vocational programmes that are being undertaken by your learners in the given academic year.



3. Key fields in the post-16 collection

Below are the main fields which are included in the calculation of the new achievement measures and therefore it is essential that you record them accurately:

- Programme Identifier used to derive the learner cohort for the programme measures and categorise which programme measure it relates to:
 - a. programme codes beginning with '0013', '0014' and '0015 are included in the AS cohort for the general education programme measure.
 - b. programme codes beginning with '01', '02', '03', '04', '05', '06', '07', '08', '09','11', '14' and '15' are included in the cohort for the vocational programme measure.
- Programme Reference If a learner has multiple programmes (e.g. multiple AS programmes, multiple A2 programmes), the most recent programme (according to programme start date) will count towards the performance measures.
- Programme Start Date used to derive the learner cohort for the programme measures. Any learner on a programme with a start date within the given academic year will be included.
- Programme Actual End Date used to identify learners who terminate a learning programme within 8 weeks of commencing. These learners are treated as early dropouts and excluded from the calculations for completion, retention and attainment (this does not apply to A2 level programmes).
- Programme Completion Status used to derive programme completion and retention:
 - a. completion rate is defined as the number of learners with completed learning programmes (completion status = 2) divided by the number of learners enrolled on learning programmes (at 8 week point).

- b. learners are only shown as being retained and started A2 if they are recorded as having completed an AS programme.
- QWAD (Qualifications Wales Approval/Designation number) used to identify the subject, qualification type, level of the learning and other relevant information relating to the learning activity. This will allow learning activity data from the Post 16 collection to be matched to data from the WED (Welsh Examinations Database) to calculate attainment measures.
- Learning activity category used to identify which learning activities will be included in the vocational success measure. Academic qualifications delivered as part of vocational programmes will be included if they have been recorded as main qualifications.
- Learning activity start date used to measure completion rates for the Welsh Baccalaureate and vocational activity success measures.
- Learning activity end date used to measure completion rates for the Welsh Baccalaureate and vocational activity success measures.
- Learning activity completion status used to measure completion rates for the Welsh Baccalaureate and vocational activity success measures.
