Dear Colleagues,

Background

In 2019 the Welsh Government declared a climate emergency for Wales to help trigger more focus and greater action to meet the challenges presented by the climate crisis.

Wales has a legally binding target to deliver the goal of net-zero emissions by 2050, alongside an ambition for the public sector in Wales to be collectively net zero carbon by 2030.

In 2018/19 the <u>NHS Wales Carbon Footprint</u> was estimated to be **1,001,378 tCO2e**, and these 'health emissions' are approximately 2.6% of Wales' total emissions.

A recent Let's Talk Public Health panel survey conducted by Public Health Wales identified that:

- 81% of people are concerned (40% very) about climate change, and that,
- 72% of people agreed (21% strongly) that it is their responsibility to do something about climate change.

Therefore, although the Welsh Government Health and Social Care Climate Emergency National Programme has been established to enable the leadership and collaboration needed to deliver a net zero and climate resilient sector, it is recognised that **ALL NHS Wales Staff** are best placed to affect and support the delivery of sustainable change.

The experience and creativity of NHS Wales staff through their peer-to-peer learning and engagement can inspire, motivate and help achieve essential sustainable improvements required by the Health sector to collectively contribute to the public sector ambition, and wider Wales climate change targets.
