- 1. How many members of the public were consulted.

- 5. How much of public money did the consultation cost.
- 6. Who carried out the consultation.
- 7. How much of public money is it costing to implement the 20mph limit.

Our response

For questions 1-4 the information requested can be seen at 20mph public attitudes survey: further research (gov.wales) and The state of the evidence on 20mph speed limits with regards to road safety, active travel and air pollution impacts: August 2018 (gov.wales). A survey of a representative sample of 1,002 adults across Wales was carried out in November 2020 using the Wales Omnibus survey. For question 5&6, Beaufort Research were commissioned by the Welsh Government to assess public attitudes towards a default 20mph speed limit on restricted roads in 2020 at a cost of £30.138.
