What was the value of each of the fracture loads?

2. Page 33 of the above article refers to "factors that might increase the likelihood of brittle fracture of hangers in service".

What are those factors?

For question one, table 3 from COWI's Qualitative Review contains the following information (reproduced from the 1988 Gibb & Partner Report NMWTRA Ref ER106E).

Table 3 - Failure loads of 1988 hanger tests

* Socket M10E Bottom failed at 807kN but had previously sustained a load of 837kN.

For question two, the following factors increase the likelihood of brittle fracture:

- Toughness of the material
- Low Temperatures

- Tensile Stress
- High Loading Rates
- Grain Structure
- Crack Initiating Defects
