ATISN 19034 – 20mph speed limit

Thank you for your request which was received on 20 September 2023. You asked for the following information:

- 1. The final monetary cost to print, ship and deliver the "Get ready for 20mph" flyers.
- 2. The full data/report proving the claim of 'Most people in Wales (63%) support a lower speed limit where they live'.
- 3. How many people were unfortunately killed in Wales in the past 5 years by cars being driven between 20 and 30 miles per hour?

Our responses to your queries are below.

- 1. The anticipated costs of printing, shipping and delivering the 20mph leaflets is £129, 337.
- This is detailed in the Omnibus survey responses published on the Welsh Government website at <u>https://www.gov.wales/20mph-public-attitudes-research</u> (see document titled 20mph Public Attitudes Further Research). It represents the responses to the question, on page 8: QMH2 Would you support a speed limit of 20mph in the area in which you live?
- 3. I can confirm that the Welsh Government does not hold information in relation to driving speed. However, the tables at the following links include information on the number of fatalities by the speed limit of the road where the collision occurred.
