Summary

This Circular Letter is issued with the agreement of the Deputy Minister for Social Services. Please ensure that its contents are communicated to all interested parties as soon as possible.

The purpose of this Circular Letter is to advise the childcare and playwork sector in Wales of an extension to lead in times for Standard 13.4(CM) of the <u>National Minimum Standards for</u> <u>Regulated Childcare</u> and of two other miscellaneous changes.

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The National Minimum Standards for Regulated Childcare for children up to the age of 12 years: latest changes

In May 2023, the Welsh Government published an update to the National Minimum Standards for Regulated Childcare which introduced a new standard for Child minders working with assistants as set out below:

13.4(CM) Any assistant employed by a child minder must have successfully completed an appropriate course recognised in the Social Care Wales's Qualification Framework. Assistants are required to have attained the required qualification by the end of November 2023.

This circular extends the deadline to meet this requirement until <u>30 November 2024</u>. This is to allow sufficient time for an appropriate course to be accessed and completed. The standard now reads as:

13.4(CM) Any assistant employed by a child minder must have successfully completed an appropriate course recognised in the Social Care Wales's Qualification Framework. Assistants are required to have attained the required qualification by the end of November 2024.

We have also used this opportunity to make two additional changes to the National Minimum Standards for Regulated Childcare as follows:

1. In June 2023, following feedback from stakeholders representing both the education and childcare sectors and with careful consideration, the Deputy Minister for Social Services and the Minister for Education and Welsh Language agreed that the term early childhood education and care (ECEC) would be replaced with Early Childhood Play, Learning and Care (ECPLC). Therefore, the NMS now reflects the change in terminology.

2. The wording at footnote 14 in Annex B on page 72 of the NMS which reads:

'Face to face means trainers are physically present with their trainees, where possible. This excludes the use of online platforms.'

has been amended to read:

Face to face means trainers are physically present with their trainees. This excludes the use of online platforms.

This clarifies the position concerning the mandatory face to face training required for Emergency Paediatric First Aid.
