### **Request for Information – ATISN 19376**

Thank you for your request for information dated 2 December.

### **Information requested**

- 1 In the “Trial areas” like for instance Buckley –was the level of pollution measured before the introduction of the speed limits?
- 2 Was any data in the “trial” taken before the 20 mph introduced to ascertain accidents at cars travelling 40mph, 30 mph and 20 mph?
- 3 What data is available to support the notion that the NHS will be better off by £92 million?

### **Our response**

3. Research conducted by the [Transport Research Institute \(TRI\) at Edinburgh Napier University](#) has estimated that the introduction of 20mph on residential roads across Wales will save the Welsh NHS around £92m in the first year alone.
