Thank you for your request for information dated 11 February.

Information requested

A Report was issued in year 2018 by Wales Government in the name of Minister for Economy & Transport Ken Skates, Senedd Member, seeking information on the many Un-adopted Roads in Wales. You have asked for the following –

- 1. A copy of the specific response made by 'The City & County of Swansea Council'.
- 2. Did the Minister later publish a further report(s) on the issue of Un-adopted Roads in Wales?
 - If so, please provide a link.
- 3. Since these Reports has Wales Government or the County Highway Authorities been allocated any funding to improve and adopt any of Un-adopted Roads in Wales?
- 4. Who is the current Minister responsible?
- 5. Is this topic currently on the Agenda anywhere in Wales Government, if so can I have details?

Our response

- 1. Welsh Government(WG) does not hold information of this description. It is held by Data Cymru who were working for the Welsh Local Government Association.
- 2. The information can be seen at <u>Unadopted roads in Wales: final report |</u> <u>GOV.WALES</u>
- On a pilot basis, WG invited local authorities to participate in WG funded projects. Swansea Council successfully applied for funding this year and have been awarded £100k to pilot an unadopted road improvement scheme at Field Close and Waun Gron Road.
- 4. Deputy Minister for Climate Change Lee Waters.
- 5. Welsh Government does not hold recorded information of this description. However, I can confirm it has been proposed to provide further funding in 24/25 for unadopted roads, however this has yet to be approved by the Minister.
