### **Summary**

Wessex Archaeology was commissioned by RPS for Costain Vinci Joint Venture, on behalf of the Welsh Government, to carry out an archaeological interpretation of Light Detection and Ranging (LiDAR), aerial survey-derived and satellite imagery data as part of an ongoing programme of cultural heritage assessment undertaken with regard to the proposed M4 Corridor around Newport (M4CaN) scheme.

The survey area, which encompasses 1664 hectares and stretches for approximately 25 km in length, is largely rural and low-lying, particularly on the Gwent Levels. It begins near Castleton in the west and runs eastwards through the northern Wentlooge Levels, Newport Docks and the Caldicot Levels, before passing the settlements of Magor and Undy to the north and finishing on Caldicot Moor in the east.

Interpretation of the data resulted in the recording of features across the study area. The majority of recorded features represent fields, boundaries and features related to the drainage system found on the Wentlooge and Caldicot Levels. In addition, a number of possible moated sites, enclosures and former farmsteads have been recorded, alongside palaeochannels and possible ring ditches.

### 1 INTRODUCTION

### 1.1 Project Background

- 1.1.1 Wessex Archaeology (WA) was commissioned by RPS for Costain Vinci Joint Venture (hereafter the Client), on behalf of the Welsh Government, to carry out an archaeological interpretation of LiDAR, aerial survey-derived and satellite imagery data as part of an ongoing programme of archaeological works being undertaken in advance of construction of the new M4 'Corridor around Newport' (CaN) road scheme. The survey area, hereafter referred to as 'the Study Area', is located between NGR 323700 183600 in the west and NGR 346500 186600 in the east.
- 1.1.2 The assessment was carried out in order to establish the location of archaeological features within the Study Area identifiable through the interrogation of various LiDAR and aerial survey-derived datasets.

### 1.2 The Study Area

- 1.2.1 The Study Area (**Figure 1**) is largely rural, encompassing a small number of villages and isolated farms. It begins near Castleton in the west and runs eastwards through the northern Wentlooge Levels, Newport Docks and the Caldicot Levels, before passing the settlements of Magor and Undy to the north and finishing on Caldicot Moor in the east. It measures 1664 hectares and stretches for approximately 25 km in length.
- 1.2.2 It is largely low-lying, particularly on the Wentlooge and Caldicot Levels (collectively known as the 'Gwent Levels'), with a mean elevation across the Study Area of c. 20 m AOD. In the west of the Study Area, elevated land lies immediately north of the M4 near Castleton, where the land rises northwards towards Pen-y-Lan Camp. In the east the land rises to the north of Magor and Undy.
- 1.2.3 It is punctuated by two notable north-south running watercourses the Ebbw River and the River Usk at Newport Docks. In addition to this are the large number of reens that help drain the land southwards. The former course of the Ebbw River can be traced using historic mapping into the early 20<sup>th</sup> century; this former course now lies beneath the Alexandra Docks at Newport.

### 1.3 Archaeological Background

- 1.3.1 The Study Area has been the subject of a number of studies and surveys in recent years, including geophysical surveys (WA 2008a; WA 2015, reproduced as Appendix 8.4 of this ES). A summary of the archaeological background of the Study Area can be found in the recent Archaeology and Cultural Heritage Baseline Assessment (Wessex Archaeology 2014) and also in the Desk-based Assessment presented as Appendix 8.2 of this ES.
- 1.3.2 WA have previously carried out LiDAR interpretation in the area (WA 2008b). The survey



- highlighted the presence of a number of features within the Study Area, including palaeochannels, former field boundaries and drainage features and moated and enclosed sites. The study also examined the microtopography of the Levels, providing an examination of the pattern of drainage features in respect of changes in the landscape.
- 1.3.3 Landscape use can be seen to date back to the Mesolithic, as evidenced by the presence of deposits at Llandevenny and Magor. Later prehistoric remains have also been recovered from Magor. A standing stone with possible prehistoric origins lies to the east of Undy.
- 1.3.4 Roman fortresses in the surrounding area, including at Caerleon, were linked by a series of roads, a number of which pass through the Study Area.
- 1.3.5 The medieval and post-medieval periods saw the accelerated development of the drainage system present across the Gwent Levels, and the historic importance of the Gwent Levels is displayed through its designation as a Landscape of Outstanding Historic Interest in Wales.
- 1.3.6 Those areas of the Study Area within the Wentlooge and Caldicot Levels are covered with a large-scale drainage system consisting of 'ridge and vurrow', 'grips', field ditches and 'reens'. The ridge and vurrow and grips help to drain the fields, from which water is ultimately drained into larger watercourses, such as the River Usk and the Ebbw River, via the reens (Rippon 1996).
- 1.3.7 The process began, in places, during the medieval period and continues to this day through the management of the different elements of the system. Despite the longevity of the drainage system, some areas, such as Caldicot Moor, were first enclosed as late the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century.
- 1.3.8 Of a possible similar date are the moated sites and enclosures discovered during previous assessment of LiDAR data. Following their identification they were subject to a walkover survey. In addition to these sites is the scheduled moated site at Elm Farm, Undy.
- 1.3.9 The 20<sup>th</sup> century saw the development of the Alexandra Docks at Newport, resulting in changes in the landscape, including the diverting of the Ebbw River.

### 2 METHODOLOGY

- 2.1.1 The LiDAR survey for the Study Area (**Figures 2-6**) was undertaken by Network Mapping for Arup (Network Mapping 2015). The data were provided as ASCII XYZ and LAS files with a 0.025m vertical and horizontal precision. These came in both Digital Surface Model (DSM) and Digital Terrain Model (DTM) forms. The DTM was the preferred dataset, owing to being able to 'see beneath' the vegetation.
- 2.1.2 Photogrammetry data were acquired on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> September 2015 by Callen-Lenz in the Red Green Blue (RGB) and Near Infra-Red (NIR) spectral ranges using a Cessna 172 with a full frame Canon EOS 5DS R. Infra-Red data was captured using a 780 nm high pass filter.
- 2.1.3 The data were provided as TIFF files with a 0.2m horizontal resolution. Unlike the LiDAR DTM, the aerial survey-derived DSM (**Figures 7-11**) includes surface features such as buildings and vegetation. As such, the DSM cannot be used to see beneath features in the same way as LiDAR DTM and its derived datasets. Orthorectified full colour RGB and near-infrared (NIR) aerial imagery of the Study Area was also provided.



- 2.1.4 ArcGIS 10.3 was used to display and analyse the survey datasets and to record features. The Spatial Analyst extension was used as this provides additional tools that allow features within the datasets to be enhanced, making interpretation easier.
- 2.1.5 Slope maps of both the LiDAR DTM and the aerial survey-derived DSM were created and styled in a manner allowing changes in the height values between adjacent cells to be highlighted (English Heritage 2010: 10).
- 2.1.6 A series of hillshades of both the LiDAR DTM and aerial survey-derived DSM were created, with the position of the light source increasing at 45° intervals. The hillshaded images provided a means of emphasising slight changes in height in the two height models, helping to highlight the banks and ditches characteristic of archaeological features (English Heritage 2010: 37).
- 2.1.7 Principal Components Analysis (PCA) was then carried out on the two resulting sets of eight hillshades, creating a single dataset for both the LiDAR DTM and aerial survey-derived DSM in which common values across the eight datasets were retained, effectively creating a single hillshade dataset representative of the eight input hillshade models (English Heritage 2010: 23).
- 2.1.8 An additional Normalized Difference Vegetation Index (NDVI) of the aerial survey-derived dataset was created (**Figures 12-16**). A NDVI is a vegetation index that helps to highlight vegetation stress and, potentially, the presence of archaeological features (Parcak 2009: 92-93). The NDVI was created using the following equation, where R is the Red band of the RGB dataset:

$$NDVI = \frac{(NIR - R)}{(NIR + R)}$$

- 2.1.9 Alongside the height data and aerial survey-derived imagery, additional aerial imagery was also provided by Network Mapping and the Welsh Government.
- 2.1.10 Orthorectified satellite data was also acquired for the Study Area and was processed by Geo Smart Decisions. The three following datasets were processed and analysed: Pleiades, SPOT7 and WorldView 2. Datasets with low levels of vegetation cover were sourced.
- 2.1.11 Pleaides data was provided as TIFF files with a 2 m resolution. The data is comprised of four bands: Red, Green, Blue and NIR, alongside an additional panchromatic band.
- 2.1.12 SPOT7 data was provided as TIFF files with a 6 m resolution. The data is comprised of four bands: Red, Green, Blue and NIR, alongside an additional panchromatic band.
- 2.1.13 WorldView 2 was provided as TIFF files with a 2 m resolution. The data is comprised of eight bands: Coastal, Blue, Green, Yellow, Red, Red Edge, NIR1 and NIR2, alongside an additional panchromatic band.
- 2.1.14 Five datasets were derived from the three satellite datasets and took the form of two vegetation indices (Simple Ratio (SR) and NDVI (**Figures 17-31**) alongside PCA, a mosaiced dataset and albedo. The SR is calculated using the following equation, where R is the Red band of the RGB dataset:

$$SR = \frac{NIR}{R}$$



- 2.1.15 The datasets outlined above were used to digitise the archaeological interpretation in ArcGIS 10.3. Archaeological features were mapped in accordance with guidance developed by the National Mapping Programme (Aerial Survey and Investigation, Swindon 2010; Bishop and Oakey 2010; and National Mapping Programme 2010) and were recorded in a geodatabase that uses standard NMP forms and corresponding symbology to ensure compliance.
- 2.1.16 Each component of an archaeological feature was mapped and, once complete, was contained within a 'monument polygon'. Each monument polygon represents the full extent of the recorded feature (Bishop and Oakey 2010). A monument polygon can contain one feature (e.g. a ring ditch) or several associated features (e.g. a ditch and associated bank).
- 2.1.17 Monument polygons were assigned consecutive chronological numbers, starting with 1001. A complete list of monument polygons, alongside descriptions of the transcribed features within, can be found in Appendix 1. The NGR is calculated as the centroid of the monument polygon.
- 2.1.18 The interpretation was complemented by the study of historic 1:2500 OS mapping, ranging in date from the 1880s (Epoch 1) to the post-war period (Epoch 5-9 composite). The OS map epochs referred to in the gazetteer in Appendix 1 date to the following:

- 2.1.19 In addition to historic mapping, OS VectorMapLocal (VML), a modern 1:10000 scale dataset containing field boundaries, tracks and buildings, was also used throughout the assessment. Features mapped on the VML dataset were not recorded during the present study.
- 2.1.20 Locations of known archaeological features were provided with the inclusion of Cadw designated sites data (most notably Scheduled Ancient Monuments) and Glamorgan Gwent Archaeological Trust (GGAT) Historic Environment Record (HER) data. Where mapped features have a SAM number or GGAT HER reference then these are provided in the gazetteer in Appendix 1.
- 2.1.21 Where referred to in the text, the main archaeological periods are broadly defined by the following date ranges:

#### 3 RESULTS

#### 3.1 Introduction

- 3.1.1 The interpretation resulted in the recording of 317 monument polygons, comprised of a total of 1220 components (**Figures 32-40**). Features were observed across the Study Area.
- 3.1.2 The majority of recorded features represent fields, boundaries and features related to the drainage system. These are present across both the Wentlooge and Caldicot Levels and represent the 'ridge and vurrow', 'grips' and 'reens' typical of the Gwent Levels.
- 3.1.3 In addition, a number of possible moated sites, enclosures and former farmsteads have been recorded. Many of these were recorded during the previous LiDAR survey, although a small number of new sites have been noted and additions to previously recorded sites made.
- 3.1.4 Additional features of note also include palaeochannels and possible ring ditches.

### 3.2 Moated sites

- 3.2.1 A number of 'moated sites' have been transcribed (Figure 41), the majority of which were recorded during the previous LiDAR survey. Their forms can often be traced beneath the alignment of modern field boundaries and drains, although several examples share boundaries with, or are aligned and contained within, the present pattern of fields. Their distribution is spread across the Study Area, although concentrations can be seen to exist on the Gwent Levels.
- 3.2.2 Their appearance in the LiDAR data takes the form of shallower yet wider ditches when compared with the later, sharper, drainage features. Some features recorded within these monument polygons are likely to represent ditches within the drainage system.
- 3.2.3 Two previously recorded sites (**1090** and **1091**) are located on the Wentlooge Level, separated by 70 m across Lighthouse Road. The sites take different forms; **1090** takes the form of a 17 m x 17 m ditch, while **1091** appears as two separate platforms. Despite this difference in form they share an alignment, suggesting possible contemporaneity.
- 3.2.4 Approximately 700 m to the north-east of **1090** and **1091** lie **1111** and **1112**. The southern site, **1111**, has not been previously recorded, but the ditch profile appears similar to **1112** to the north, suggesting they are possibly linked. **1112** is previously recorded and takes the form of a series of ditches either side of Pont-y-cwcw Reen. An additional north-west extension has also been recorded during the present study.
- 3.2.5 On the Caldicot Levels lies **1137**, a previously recorded moated site to the south of Picked Lane. The features are contained within an area measuring 90 m x 30 m at the greatest



- extent. A number of ditches lie on a slightly different alignment to the later drainage system (1138).
- 3.2.6 A larger complex of sites is located near Arch Farm. Central to these is 1161, a series of ditches located across 2.8 hectares. The features have been previously recorded and help form a number of platforms. These ditches appear shallower and wider in form than the later drainage system (1163). Additional ditches form 'spurs' to the north-east, one of which appears to continue as 1160. To the east of these lies 1162, a further previously recorded site. Finally, to the south of Arch Farm lies 1166, an 'L'-shaped section of ditch representing a further previously recorded site.
- 3.2.7 Approximately 600 m north-east of the Arch Farm complex lies **1178**, a series of ditches again representing a previously recorded moated site. The features are spread across 2.1 hectares. Further ditch features, similar in form and sharing an alignment, have also been recorded in addition to the previously recorded extents.
- 3.2.8 Previously recorded features at Moorbarn Farm (1191) have also been recorded. They are contained within an area measuring 1 hectare and take the form of a number of platforms.
- 3.2.9 An 'L'-shaped ditch 35 m in length (1221) can be seen in the corner of a field between North Row and Rush Wall. It represents a previously recorded moated site. 700 m to the north-east lies a further ditch feature (1230) which is possibly representative of a moated site, due to its similarities with sites such as 1221.
- 3.2.10 The easternmost of the possible moated sites, **1271**, takes the form of a series of ditches to the north of Undy, spread across 1.6 hectares. They may also represent an earlier field pattern.
- 3.2.11 The scheduled moated site at Undy (1291) can be easily traced in all datasets. This site differs in form to many of the examples described above, although parallels can be drawn with 1086 and 1158 due to the overall square appearance of the features. A series of slight, parallel banks associated with the remains are likely to represent later, orchard-related features.
- 3.2.12 An additional possible enclosure site also requires attention. 1300 is formed of a series of ditches and lies to the north of Moor Ditch on the edge of Caldicot Moor. The ditches appear to represent an enclosure, although they differ in form to other moated sites in the area; in particular, the ditches are more pronounced in the LiDAR data. A circular mound of unknown function, 10 m in diameter, lies within the enclosed area.

### 3.3 Farmsteads

- 3.3.1 Remains associated with former farmsteads can be found within the western section of the Study Area, to the west of the B4239 (Figure 42). These take the form of short sections of bank and, occasionally, ditch. These farmsteads are all present on historic mapping.
- 3.3.2 To the east of Pant-rhiw-goch lie a series of remains associated with Pant-rhiw-goch-ganol (1003). Due to tree coverage these features are only visible in the LiDAR-derived datasets. Features can be traced across an area measuring 30 m x 15 m at their greatest extent. A former field boundary, 1001, is visible to the west, forming a boundary between Pant-rhiw-goch-ganol and Pant-rhiw-goch.



- 3.3.3 Banks and structural remains relating to Great Pen-carn (**1046**), a manor house with 14th century origins, can be traced in a small area of woodland to the north of the Wentlooge Levels. The features are spread over 0.5 hectares and trace the walls of buildings and the locations of boundaries as present on historic mapping.
- 3.3.4 In addition to the western sites, further examples to the east may also represent remains associated with former farmsteads. The moated site **1090** may represent remains associated with Ty-hir, a farmstead also present on historic mapping. A 40 m long section of ditch associated with the former farmstead of Ty-pridd (**1194**) represents a further example of a field boundary associated with a former farmstead.
- 3.3.5 Although not representing a former farmstead, Ysgubor y Lan (1031) presents an example of a barn recorded on historic mapping. The remains are also marked on VML but are recorded here as their remains on the historic OS maps include a complete east-facing side. The remains are formed of a rectangular bank measuring 12 m x 6 m.

### 3.4 Drainage Systems

- 3.4.1 By far the most ubiquitous features present in the data relate to the drainage systems found across the Gwent Levels (**Figure 43**). Most are formed of regular, rectangular field ditches, within which lie ridge and vurrow and grips. A number of the recorded features are present on the historic OS maps.
- 3.4.2 The drainage system in the Wentlooge Levels follows a largely south-west to north-east alignment. The system is present and uninterrupted along a 3 km stretch of the Study Area, terminating on the bank of the Ebbw River. Typical examples include **1053**, **1066**, **1077** and **1114**. Remnants of now-lost drainage system features can also be traced on the diverted west bank of the Ebbw River (**1121**).
- 3.4.3 In the east, the alignment of the drainage system in the Caldicot Levels is slightly more disjointed, although with a general tendency towards north-west to south-east. Typical features include **1148**, **1185** and **1201**. Much like on the Wentlooge Levels, the system is largely uninterrupted.
- 3.4.4 The latest features in the Study Area, on Caldicot Moor at the far eastern end, are also the most geometrically precise. They are contained within a drainage system representing short-term, rather than piecemeal, development.

### 3.5 Other Archaeological Features

- 3.5.1 Protection from the sea is visible in the flood defences found along the northern bank of the River Usk (1125), where elements of the post-medieval sea wall can be traced intermittently over the course of 1 km.
- 3.5.2 Five possible ring ditches have been identified. **1224** is located to the south-west of Tonew Kennels in the north of the Caldicot Levels and takes the form of a circular feature 17 m in diameter. It is most prominent in NIR imagery. The path of the feature is interrupted slightly at its easternmost point, possibly by later drainage features (**1223**).
- 3.5.3 To the east of Undy lies **1293**, a feature visible in both the LiDAR data and NIR imagery. The feature lies 60 m to the west of **1292**, a scheduled standing stone with possible Bronze Age origins. A further three ring ditches lie in a group to the north-east of Llandevenny (**1259**). Their origins are unclear, and some or all may represent cattle feeders.



- 3.5.4 A short, 50 m long section of possible Roman road can be traced to the north of Magor (1265). Despite the presence of a number of putative Roman roads within the Study Area, this is the only section visible in the data.
- 3.5.5 Former quarrying is visible to the south-east of Knollbury in the form of a cut feature measuring 40 m x 15 m at its greatest extent (1273). The feature is marked as an 'Old Quarry' on historic mapping.
- 3.5.6 Away from the low-lying land of the Wentlooge and Caldicot Levels, the field system is more frequently defined by banks representing present and former hedgerows. To the north-east of Undy, a system of former field boundaries can be traced across 22 hectares (1285; Figure 44). A number are marked on historic mapping, with additional unmapped banks appearing on the same alignment. They are probably related to an area of possible ridge and furrow (1286), alongside similar boundaries on a shared alignment to the south (1287, 8.1 hectares) and east (1288, 17 hectares).
- 3.5.7 It is possible to trace further features to the north-west of Magor. Here, a series of banks located across 13 hectares (1258) bear similarities with the extensive complex of earthworks at Arch Farm but appear to instead represent plough headlands. They may also represent, in part, an earlier pattern of fields. Probably contemporaneous with 1258 is 1260, three blocks of ridge and furrow fitting within the features. Additionally, 1262, a series of ditches on a different alignment to 1258 and 1260, is visible in the WorldView 2 dataset.

#### 3.6 Palaeochannels

- 3.6.1 Evidence for palaeochannels can be seen across the Study Area. A number of features of similar form may be of a more recent date and represent run-off in the fields (for example, **1006**, **1107** and **1196**, where a series of channels run towards Middle Reen).
- 3.6.2 A series of channels are present on Green Moor (**Figure 45**). To the west, **1212** may also represent changes in topography. The central features on Green Moor are recorded within **1213**, and are represented by a series of channels spread across 28 hectares. These channels are present in both the LiDAR data and aerial imagery. To the south lies **1218**, comprised of a sinuous northern channel which forks to the south. Further channels can be traced 500 m to the east of the features on Green Moor (**1241**).
- 3.6.3 Caldicot Moor provides a further setting for palaeochannels on the Caldicot Levels (1303), where channels are present across 167 hectares. Although a number appear to represent recent run-off, the paths of many can be traced beneath the field system.

#### 4 CONCLUSIONS

- 4.1.1 Through the study of a combination of LiDAR data, aerial survey-derived data and satellite imagery it has proved possible to rapidly capture a large number of features across a wide area (in this instance a 25 km long linear scheme). Recorded archaeological and historical features range in date from the later prehistoric to the modern, with the majority appearing to have post-medieval, 19<sup>th</sup> century and modern origins.
- 4.1.2 The recorded features range in form from moated sites, former farmsteads and earlier field patterns to palaeochannels and drainage system remains. Furthermore, these features help to highlight the differing forms of the landscapes present on the Gwent Levels and of those beyond the wetland-dryland interface.



- 4.1.3 Elements of the drainage system are undoubtedly the most frequently encountered features within the Study Area. Although many of these elements, in particular the ridge and vurrow and grips, are most are likely to be modern in date, study of historic mapping suggests at least a 19<sup>th</sup> century origin for elements of the system, and so there is likely to be much re-use of channels.
- 4.1.4 The moated sites and enclosures recorded during the previous LiDAR survey have also been encountered here, with negligible change displayed in terms of the survival of these earthworks. Additional elements of some of these sites have also been recorded, as have further possible examples, based upon typology and their relationships with the surrounding drainage systems. Taken as a whole, the moated sites and the drainage systems help to provide an extensive picture of the recent history of the Gwent Levels.
- 4.1.5 In addition, the survey has allowed a small number of former farmsteads to be mapped. Additional sites of interest have also been recorded during the present study, including possible ring ditches, while evidence of agricultural activity away from the Gwent Levels can be seen to take the form of former field banks, plough headlands and associated ridge and furrow. Earlier flood defences are also present within the Study Area, most notably in the form of an intermittent bank on the eastern bank of the River Usk.
- 4.1.6 Palaeochannels, extensively recorded during the previous LiDAR survey, have also been encountered in the Study Area, although early Holocene deposits appear to be too deep across the Gwent Levels to be present within the datasets studied here. As a result, the majority of recorded palaeochannel features are likely to be relatively modern in date.
- 4.1.7 Ultimately, the present study has provided a means of identifying a large number of sites of archaeological and historical interest, while also allowing them to be recorded to a level of detail which provides a means of understanding the various components of the landscape.
