Thank you for your request which I received on the 25<sup>th</sup> of March. You asked for:

- 1. The amount of energy generated by Pembroke CCGT gas-fired power station.
- 2. Where the electricity generated is utilised.
- 3. Whether it is fed into the National Grid in Pembrokeshire.
- 4. If it isn't, where it is fed into the National Grid.
- 5. The amount of electricity used in Wales in 2023.
- 6. Whether energy companies should accurately depict the scale of wind turbines in photographs on their websites.
- 7. Whether it is illegal for energy companies to use scaled-down photographs of wind turbines on their websites.
- 8. Whether a Senedd Member or Member of Parliament are obliged to make a 'declaration of vested interest' if their spouse is the director of an energy company.

## Our response

- 1. Pembroke CCGT Gas-fired Power Station has a capacity of 2,199 MW, and had a final generation of 15,281,690 MWh in 2022
- 2. Electricity from the site is fed into the National Grid to support the Great British energy network. The operation of the electricity network is reserved to the UK Government and overseen by the Energy System Operator.
- 3. The power station has a connection to the National Grid through the substation adjacent to the site in Pembrokeshire.
