Our response

Welsh Government holds the freehold title to land parcels at the location you have identified. It is recorded at HM Land Registry under title numbers CYM509109 and WA426808 and as such is information already in the public domain.

The land has not been marketed for sale and there are no negotiations in place.

The land has not been declared surplus and as such we are not accepting nor inviting any formal offers to purchase at this time. Welsh Government has published a disposal guide which provides the general methodology for dealing with surplus land.
