About the AIS



We are the Welsh Government.



This document is about the Accessible Information Standard (AIS).



We will call it the **AIS** for short.

The **AIS** is a set of rules.

The rules say GP practices must:

• Find out if someone needs help to understand or communicate.

- Give people information they can understand.
- Give people support to communicate if they need it.

Who the AIS is for

The **AIS** supports everyone who needs support to understand or communicate.

This includes people who:



 Are D/deaf, deafened, or hard of hearing.



• Use British Sign Language.



• Are blind or have poor eyesight.



• Are deafblind.

• Are disabled.











- Have dementia.
- Are neurodivergent. Neurodivergent means people whose brains work differently. For example, autism is a neurodivergent condition.
- Find reading or writing hard.
- Are parents or carers who find it hard to understand or communicate.
- Do not speak English or Welsh as their main language.

We have updated the **AIS** to make sure **everyone** is supported. The old **AIS** only supported people who have sight or hearing loss.

What the AIS does

The **AIS** makes sure people get:

1. **Information they can understand.** For example:



• Easy Read

large print

• Large print



• Braille



• By email



• By phone



• By video

2. **Communication support they need.** For example:



• A British Sign Language interpreter.



• An interpreter for their own language.



All GP practices in Wales must follow the AIS.

What GP practices must do

All staff at GP practices must:



1. Ask

Find out if you or your carer needs help with information or communication.



2. Record

Write down what help you need in a clear way.



Make sure your needs are easy to see on your health record.



4. Share

Share this information with other NHS services if needed.

Follow the correct rules about sharing information.



5. Act

Make sure you get the right support and information in a way you understand.

Why this is important

The **AIS** helps GP practices give the right help to people who find communication harder.

Good communication means people:

- Understand their health and care
- Feel confident to ask questions
- Can make good choices
- Are more likely to stay healthy
