Please find below our response to your request for information from 27 of August and 30 August. We apologise for the slight delay.

Your Request

You asked for:

1. The total amount of Active Travel grants paid to Welsh councils under the Active Travel Act for each year since the Act passed into law.
2. The amount of Active Travel grants paid to Pembrokeshire County Council under the Active Travel Act for each year since the Act passed into law.
3. Research showing the amount of bicycle use in each of the years the Active Travel Act has been in force.

Our Response

I can confirm that the Welsh Government holds the information you have requested for questions one and two. We have interpreted "Active Travel grants" as the Active Travel Fund. However please note that funding from the Active Travel Fund is not paid 'under the Active Travel Act', as the act does not include any financial provisions.

The Active Travel Fund was established in 2018 and we have included data from then until the most recent financial year 2024-25.
