The total cost of the Wales Climate Week 2025 virtual conference was £174,468.20

2) Has this event received any private business sponsors, and if so to what amount and from whom?

No there was no sponsorship associated with the event. All speakers and exhibitors participated free of charge.

- 4) It is noted that the former Minister Jane Davidson, an Arts Graduate, is addressing the conference, as a 'welcome', as such, what scientific academic qualifications does she possess?

The virtual conference featured a keynote speech from Jane Davidson, in her capacity as chair of the Wales Net Zero 2035 Challenge Group. We are unable to comment on her scientific academic qualifications.
