ATISN 26356 - Digital Health Care

Thank you for your request to the Welsh Government for information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) received on 10 November 2025 regarding the introduction of an online digital access for health in Wales.

You requested the following:

- 1. Copies of all contracts, procurement documentation, supplier award letters or pilot-project agreements associated with the introduction of a digital identity verification/online authentication service that enables citizen access to health or social-care portals (for example, via the NHS Wales App) in Wales.
- 2. For each contract or procurement: the name of the supplier, date of award, contract value, contract duration (start and end date), and a brief description of the service scope (e.g., identity verification, authentication, portal access enrolment).
- 3. Data on the rollout or pilot of the service: number of citizen users enrolled to date, number of identity verifications completed, number of users successfully granted portal access, and any related performance metrics or targets and whether they have been met.
- 4. Copies of any monitoring, evaluation or audit reports, and any governance or decision-making documents (such as board papers, internal review papers) related to the scheme.

- 1 & 2 The Welsh Government does not hold this information. Please see advice below.
- The latest NHS App Dashboard states "As of 10 November 2025, 3,995 patients have completed the Welsh Identity Verification Service (WIVS) process."
- The Welsh Government does not hold this information. However, we recently published a Welsh Health Circular on <u>identity verification for digital health services in primary care</u>.
