This is achieved through ensuring a range of professionals within both statutory and early intervention services that are suitably skilled with knowledge and an understanding of PSB and HSB in order to provide timely and appropriate interventions. This project will be evaluated with input from Bangor University with a view to future inform decision making.</p> <p>(d) CIW Internal document - (relevant extract): We saw an innovative team having been set up in Gwynedd Local Authority through the integrated Care Fund, named the Emerald team. Its aim is to reduce the number of Harmful Sexual Behaviours cases which are referred into statutory services following an incident of abuse. This is achieved through ensuring that there are a range of professionals within both statutory and early intervention services that are suitably skilled with knowledge and an understanding of PSB and Harmful Sexual Behaviours in order to provide timely and appropriate interventions. This to prevent abuse from taking place and minimise its effect. The focus is also on assessing and intervening in those cases where abuse has taken place to appropriately support both victim and perpetrator. This is an example of a project addressing issues raised within the population needs assessment and area plan. The project will be evaluated with input from Bangor University with a view to future inform decision making.</p>
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
