Upper Pant Farmhouse (ATISN 26843)

Thank you for your request which I received on Friday 27 March 2026.

You asked for all information held by Cadw relating to the listing survey of Upper Pant Farmhouse, Llanddewi Rhydderch, Abergavenny, Monmouthshire, NP7 9TL (Reference 87209, listed 09/12/2005), including:

- all photographs taken during the survey or resurvey of the property.
- any inspector's notes or survey forms; and
- any internal correspondence relating to the listing decision.

The information you requested is enclosed with an index of documents at Annex A. This disclosure contains material created by third parties outside of the Welsh Government.

It might be helpful if I explain that Upper Pant Farmhouse was considered for listing as part of a community-wide resurvey of buildings, rather than it being a detailed survey of the building in isolation. This was undertaken as part of Cadw's national programme of resurvey work to identify buildings of special architectural and historic interest.

I have redacted personal information of individuals under Regulation 13 of the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 and my reasoning for doing so is set out at Annex B.

If you are dissatisfied with the Welsh Government's handling of your request, you can ask for an internal review within 40 working days of the date of this response. Regulation 13 of the Environmental Information Regulations 2004

I have decided to withhold the following information:

Regulation 13 of the EIRs provides an exception if disclosure of the personal data would breach any of the data protection principles.

'Personal data' is defined in sections 3(2) and (3) of the Data Protection Act 2018 ('the DPA 2018') and means any information relating to an identified or identifiable living individual. An identifiable living individual is one who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location data, an online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity of the individual.

Guidance from the Information Commissioner's Office states:

- The starting point is to consider whether it would be fair to the data subject to disclose their personal data;
- If disclosure would not be fair, then the information is exempt from disclosure.

I have considered the [public interest test](#) set out in Regulation 12.1b and concluded that the individual(s) concerned would have a reasonable expectation that their personal data would be kept confidential and not disclosed to the world at large. It would be unfair to the individual concerned to release their personal data. Disclosure would give rise to unfair and unwarranted intrusion on the individual's privacy in the circumstances of this case, and has the potential to cause unnecessary and unjustified harm to the individual in this case.

I have concluded that in in this case, disclosure would not have been within the reasonable expectation of the individual and the loss of privacy would cause unwarranted distress. It is my view that disclosure of would breach the first data protection principle, and so are exempt from release under Regulation 13 of the Environmental Information Regulations 2004.

I have concluded that, in this instance, the information requested contains personal data.
