The Homelessness and Social Housing Allocation (Wales) Bill – transition and implementation planning (financial year 2026-2027)

1. Aim

To develop guidance, tools and training to deliver phase 1 of implementation of the Homelessness and Social Housing Allocation (Wales) Bill by March 2027.

2. Stakeholder engagement

A number of workstreams will be set up to support implementation of the Homelessness and Social Housing Allocation (Wales) Bill, supported by stakeholder groups. These groups will involve representation of all local authorities in Wales, alongside other key stakeholders, including representatives of under-served communities. Each of these groups will support the delivery of key objectives by March 2027. The stakeholder groups will each have their own terms of reference and will be formed for a defined period of time to deliver specific outputs.

1. Prevention and support
2. Partnership
3. Suitability
4. Children and care leavers
5. Allocations
6. Data
7. Post Custody Accommodation Working Group
8. Hospital discharge
9. Training and Development
10. Comms and campaigns
11. Armed forces pathway review

3. Engagement with people with lived experience

The Welsh Government will work with providers of existing lived experience projects to build on the engagement work undertaken to develop the Bill. The format of this engagement is yet to be fully developed but will likely involve multiple participatory methods and will provide evidence to the groups set out above.

4. Funding support

In the 2026-27 draft budget, local authorities have been allocated £2.3 million to support them to prepare for the transition to the Homelessness and Social Housing Allocation (Wales) Bill. This will be a one-off, one year funding agreement. The funding is provided to meet a range objectives to ensure local authorities stand ready to implement phase 1 of the Bill by March 2027. The Bill has reached stage 2 at the time of writing. It will not be possible to specify exactly what phase 1 will entail until the Bill is finalised but it is likely to include the prevention, support and allocations elements of the Bill. Phase 2 will focus on implementation of “ask and act” and phase 3 will include abolition of the priority need and intentionality tests.

The Regulatory Impact Assessment recognised that the exact amount of planning for each local authority will differ and is uncertain, and therefore a broad staff FTE requirement assumption was used across all local authorities to capture this cost. It estimated two FTE staff members for each LA at a cost of £2,152,600. In the budget settlement, this has been uplifted to £2.3 million. As the RIA estimate is based on a broad assumption, the Welsh Government has considered funding distribution options and would welcome the feedback of HLC on these options and further ideas for consideration.

Option 1 - Allocating funding equally across 22 LAs

All local authorities would receive just over £100,000.

Option 2 - Flat rate across most LAs, but additional funding for 5 LAs with prisons

Most LAs to receive just under £100,000, with 5 LAs with prisons (Cardiff, Swansea, Wrexham, Monmouthshire, Bridgend) to receive a small increase to begin preparation work associated with advice and information in prisons.

Discussion points for HLC

Priority for November meeting

- £2.3 million has been allocated to local authorities to assist in planning for implementation of the Bill. The funding will be aligned to objectives set out in section 5 but we would welcome views from local authorities on the options around dissemination of the allocation and its use, including the options set out in this paper.
- Local authority operational partners have flagged potential recruitment challenges. Are there alternative mechanisms we should consider which still ensure the allocated funding delivers homelessness functions?

Priority for December meeting

- How would you expect local authorities to practice and engage in the pre-implementation period?
- All local authorities will be invited to be represented across the stakeholder groups. Chairpersons for the groups are to be determined, we would welcome views on HLC on leadership of these groups and ideas for strengthening strategic engagement.
- Are there opportunities for regional/themed partnerships between local authorities you would like to explore further?

SCHEDULE 1 The Purposes

The purpose of this funding is to ensure local authorities are ready to implement phase 1 of the Homelessness and Social Housing Allocation (Wales) Act from March 2027.

This funding is one -off and is time -limited for one year only. It is intended to support preparation and transition to implementation of the new legislation, not service delivery.

Local authorities have flexibility to determine the most effective approach to delivering this work, including the use of temporary recruitment and/or external contractors.

Decisions on the number of posts, duration and level of seniority are a matter for each local authority.

The funding cannot be used to cover existing staff costs; it must be directed towards new or additional activity to support preparation for implementation of the Bill.

The Welsh Government will procure a centrally funded training package for all frontline local housing authority staff on the new Act. Local authorities are therefore not required to use this funding for training purposes.

Objectives and Eligible Activities

The funding must be used to deliver activity under the following three objectives:

Objective 1: Contribute to the development of national guidance, templates and tools

Activities may include but are not limited to preparing for and contributing to policy development and practice guidance.

Objective 2: Prepare Local Policies, Materials and Operational arrangements

Local authorities should rely on national guidance, tools and templates to update local frameworks in readiness for implementation. This preparation will align to the Welsh Government phase 1 implementation plan which will be shared with local authorities by April 1st 2026.

Objective 3: Collaborate with Welsh Government appointed training provider

To develop national local authority training offer on the Act and prepare frontline staff for training delivery and local application.

Mae penderfyniadau ar nifer y swyddi, hyd a lefel yn fater i bob awdurdod lleol.

Ni ellir defnyddio'r cyllid i dalu costau staff presennol; rhaid iddo gael ei gyfeirio at weithgaredd newydd neu ychwanegol i gefnogi'r gwaith paratoi ar gyfer gweithredu'r Bil.

Bydd Llywodraeth Cymru yn caffael pecyn hyfforddi a ariennir yn ganolog ar gyfer holl staff rheng flaen awdurdodau tai lleol ar y Ddeddf newydd. Felly, nid yw'n ofynnol i awdurdodau lleol ddefnyddio'r cyllid hwn at ddibenion hyfforddi.

Amcanion a Gweithgareddau Cymwys

Rhaid defnyddio'r cyllid i gyflawni gweithgareddau o dan y tri pedwar canlynol:

Amcan 1: Cyfrannu at ddatblygu canllawiau, templedi ac offer cenedlaethol

Gall gweithgareddau gynnwys ond heb fod yn gyfyngedig i baratoi ar gyfer ddatblygu polisi a chanllawiau ymarfer, a chyfrannu at hynny.

Amcan 2: Paratoi Polisiâu Lleol, Deunyddiau a Threfniadau Gweithredol

Dylai awdurdodau lleol ddibynnu ar ganllawiau, offer a thempledi cenedlaethol i ddiweddarau fframweithiau lleol yn barod i'w gweithredu. Bydd y gwaith paratoi hwn yn cyd-fynd â chynllun gweithredu cam 1 Llywodraeth Cymru a fydd yn cael ei rannu ag awdurdodau lleol erbyn 1 Ebrill 2026.

Amcan 3: Cydweithio â darparwr hyfforddiant a benodwyd gan Lywodraeth Cymru

Datblygu cynnig hyfforddiant awdurdodau lleol cenedlaethol ar y Ddeddf a pharatoi staff rheng flaen ar gyfer cyflwyno hyfforddiant a'i gymhwyso'n lleol.

Amcan 4: Gwasanaeth gwybodaeth a chynghori o fewn carchardai

Sefydlu ac ymgorffori cynllun ar gyfer gwasanaethau gwybodaeth a chynghori effeithiol o fewn carchardai, gan sicrhau bod pobl yn y ddalfa yn derbyn cymorth tai a digartrefedd amserol, hygyrch a chywir sy'n eu paratoi ar gyfer yr adeg pan gânt eu rhyddhau ac yn lleihau'r risg o ddigartrefedd.



Implementation

General

- Phased approach to implementation:
 - Phase 1 (2027) – prevention, duty to retain
 - Phase 2 (2028) – ask and act and duty to co-operate
 - Phase 3 (tbc – 2030?) – local connection to Wales test, priority need and intentionality
- Training to be delivered prior to commencement of phase 1
- Code of Guidance to be updated
- Development of secondary legislation to support new Act

 - Work with HMPPS as part of their implementation planning
