ATISN 26924 – Percutaneous Endoscopic Gastrostomy (PEG)

Thank you for your request to the Welsh Government for information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) received on 27 April 2026 relating to Percutaneous Endoscopic Gastrostomy (PEG) data. You requested the following:

- *To provide the following information for Wales for the most recent available year (and, if available, the previous 5 years):*
 1. *The total number of patients currently receiving enteral feeding via a percutaneous endoscopic gastrostomy (PEG) tube, with a breakdown between adults and children where available.*
 2. *The number of PEG tube insertions carried out each year across Wales.*
 3. *Any available data held centrally, or accessible via Health Boards, on patients receiving PEG feeding (including home enteral nutrition services).*
 4. *If this information is not held centrally, please confirm which organisation(s) (e.g. specific Health Boards) hold the relevant data.*

If exact PEG data is not recorded, please provide the closest available information.

Response

The Welsh Government does not hold the detail of information you are seeking.

The NHS Wales Joint Commissioning Committee (NWJCC) is responsible for commissioning severe intestinal failure services for adults and for children and young people and may hold the information you are looking for. Next Steps

The request you sent me contains personal information about you - for example, your name and address.
