### **Request for Information - ATISN 27001**

Further to your request for information of 19 May. You asked for information on Lower Town Fishguard. You wanted to receive:

1. any pedestrian safety assessments, engineering reviews or traffic studies relating to the bridge during the last ten years;
2. any correspondence or reports relating to concerns raised by councillors, local authorities or members of the public;
3. any collision, incident or near-miss data held in relation to the bridge;
4. and any internal discussions or assessments concerning road markings, warning signage, traffic calming or pedestrian mitigation measures.

### **Our response**

The Welsh Government holds some of the information you requested.

1. 2017 A487 Lower Town Feasibility Study attached
3. There is a Collision map which shows the location of collisions for the last 8 years (2018-2025) available on our interactive dashboard:

Once on the page with the map, you can use the filters at the top of the page to change which collisions you're being shown. Using the "year" filter you can click any year to only show that year's values. If you click off the currently selected year, you should be able to see every collision in the area you're looking for from 2018 to 2025. Using the "quarter" filter, it is currently default set to quarter 4. If you untick Q4, all quarters throughout that year should appear on the map. If selecting all collisions for all available years, then this may take a little while to load.

If you want to see the severity of the collision, you can select using the "severity" filter whether you would like to see fatal, serious, or slight collisions depending on what you select. However, the map is also colour coded, so red dots are fatal collisions, orange dots are serious collisions, and blue are slight.

In my letter dated 22 May 2026 I noted that your request as it stood would be very time consuming to deal with and asked you to refine your request for Q2 and Q4. I also suggested ways that would help you to specify or narrow your request for information. As you have not written further in this regard, on this occasion I have decided to refuse your request for information as it will cost more than the appropriate limit set out in the Freedom of Information and Data Protection (Appropriate Limit and Fees) Regulations 2004 to answer your request. The reasons for refusing your request were quoted in the letter sent to you dated 22 May 2026.

## Next Steps

If you are dissatisfied with the Welsh Government's handling of your request, you can ask for an internal review within 40 working days of the date of this response.
