*Official meetings held by the Cabinet Minister for Rural Resilience and Sustainability, Llŷr Gruffydd MS, since his appointment.*

*A list of all meetings with external organisations and representatives from 13 May 2026 to the date of this request.*

*For each entry, please include:*

- 1. Date and Location (including if the meeting was virtual).*
- 2. Organisation Name: The full name of all external organizations present.*
- 3. Attendee Titles: The job titles of external attendees.*
- 4. Stated Purpose: The specific policy area or agenda item as recorded in the Minister's diary or meeting request.*

## **Our response**

I have concluded that the information you requested is exempt under Section 22 of the Freedom of Information Act (2000), information intended for future publication. This information is regularly published – usually quarterly – here <https://www.gov.wales/ministerial-meetings-and-engagements>.

Section 22 is a publicly tested exemption, and I have set out my arguments for non-disclosure at Annex 1 to this letter.

## **Annex 1**

Section 22: Information intended for future publication.

The Welsh Government believes that Section 22 is applied in relation to the requested information.

Section 22 of the Freedom of Information Act is subject to the public interest test. This means that in order to withhold information under its provisions, any personal interest of the requester notwithstanding, it has to be shown that the public interest in withholding the information outweighs that in releasing it.

Public interest arguments in favour of disclosure:

The general presumption of openness and transparency, which the Freedom of Information Act aspires to.

Public interest arguments against disclosure:

This information is regularly published – usually quarterly – here <https://www.gov.wales/ministerial-meetings-and-engagements>. In line with the normal protocol for elections years, the return for the period prior to the formation of a new government has been published as a single document, covering both the first quarter and the remaining period covering April and May. The information for the remainder of the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter and the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter will be published in October according to the usual schedule and is being collated accordingly.

The Welsh Government acknowledges the public interest in openness and transparency and is committing to publishing details of Ministerial meetings and engagements accordingly. Therefore, we believe the public interest would be better served in the information being published at the appropriate time when it has been fully collated. To that end, I believe the information should be withheld under s22 of the Act, until it is published in due course.
