ATISN 27327 – Additional NHS Funding

Thank you for your request to Welsh Government for information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) received on 11 August 2026 relating to the additional NHS funding.

You requested the following information:

1. *Can the Welsh Government clarify whether health boards in Wales will be permitted to use funding allocated to them from the £100 million in additional revenue funding announced to reduce NHS waiting times to commission cross-border healthcare services, without restriction?*
2. *Can the Welsh Government confirm what proportion of the £100 million in additional revenue funding will be allocated to Powys Teaching Health Board, and what the total value of this allocation will be?*
3. *Can the Welsh Government confirm what proportion of:*
 - a. *the £25 million of capital funding announced for new surgical and diagnostic hubs; and*
 - b. *the £20 million of capital funding announced for essential maintenance across the NHS estate will be allocated to Powys Teaching Health Board, and what the total value of each allocation will be?*

Our Response

1. The process for assessing health board plans submitted in relation to the additional £120 million revenue funding is currently underway. As decisions on allocations and associated conditions of funding have not yet been finalised, Welsh Government is unable to provide further information at this time. Further details will be made available once the assessment process has concluded.

2. The assessment and allocation process for the additional revenue funding is ongoing. Welsh Government has received a plan from Powys Teaching Health Board and funding allocations will be considered following completion of the assessment process. As no final decisions have yet been made, we are unable to confirm the proportion or value of any allocation to Powys Teaching Health Board at this stage.
- 3a The expert surgical group will deliver its recommendations to the minister by end of this calendar year, and we can confirm that no capital funding has been allocated against this yet.

3b We are able to confirm that an additional £0.9m capital funding has been provided to Powys Teaching Health Board for estates backlog and £0.350m capital for digital backlog investment.

Next Steps
